1. Agenda

Neset moved, Bye seconded, to approve the agenda as presented.

Research Items:

2. Dakota College of Bottineau's Research Presentation

Mr. Keith Knudson, Department Chair for Agriculture and Horticulture and Dean of DCB, Dr. Jerry Migler, presented on <u>DCB's research activities</u>.

3. Research Metrics and Activities

Dr. Mihelich reviewed the attached documents (<u>Research Metrics</u> and <u>Activities</u>), regarding HERD Data for UND and NDSU. NDSU President Bresciani was inaudible, and Dr. Jane Schuh was not able to be present; they did not have an opportunity to speak on behalf of NDSU data presented. The committee requested NDSU HERD information be reviewed at their April meeting.

Governance Items:

4. Presidential Evaluations – Link to SPOL document / Eval Plan

Mr. Jerry Rostad provided the committee with a summary of the timeline for <u>comprehensive</u> <u>evaluations</u> of campus Presidents and how they will be accumulated and derived. The information is based on input from the Chancellor, campus Presidents, and Committee members, over the past several months. The process will have five primary sources of information:

- 1. <u>Strategic Planning Online (SPOL)</u> is currently used to establish president's goals and annually track progress the completion of those goals. SPOL ties directly back to the five NDUS goals established by the State Board of Higher Education.
- 2. A self-assessment provided by the campus president.
- 3. Institutional data will be collected and analyzed from the previous five years of the president's administration (total tenure if less than five years). Data points will include retention, graduation rates, enrollment, money raised, and research/HERD survey (if applicable).
- 4. A seventeen question internal online survey will be distributed via email to the institution's students, faculty, staff, and alumni/business community. A copy of the survey questions are attached, and questions will be focused by specific groups. Responses will be anonymous, and the system office staff will work with the institution's foundation president/executive director to disseminate the external survey.
- 5. A focus group assessment/an assessment team will conduct focus group discussions with the president's cabinet; the institution's students, faculty, and staff; and alumni/community/friends of the institution(s).
 - One SBHE Board Member
 - The NDUS Vice Chancellor for Strategic Planning
 - One NDUS office staff member to provide administrative support.

The system office staff will work with the institution's foundation leadership in coordinating the external session(s).

The committee discussed and concluded to proceed with the presidential comprehensive review documents as presented. Prior to the March full Board meeting, Mr. Rostad will follow-up with committee member Bye for some clarification to the details. The full Board will discuss and act for final approval.

Neset moved, Bye seconded, to recommend approval of the comprehensive review process and procedures, contingent on legal review, to the full Board.

Bye, Neset, and Ryan voted yes.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m. CT.
