NDUS staff reviewed NDCC 15-10-48 through 15-10-53 and reached out to the Attorney Generals office for additional review, to ensure the updates from the latest legislative session were in alignment with the Rules of Operation, as requested by the committee. The pooled funding section was updated based on recent legislation to display the different pools and how each campus can access them. The rules currently state that applications are to be considered in chronological order, which is in alignment with century code, and was how the applications were provided at the January 2023 meeting. The committee ultimately makes the determination on how the funding is distributed and has the authority to define the process for inclusion in the Rules of Operation.

The committee discussed restructuring how pooled funds are accessed and distributed, an option for institutions to request an extension rather than pooling unused funds, and whether UND School of Medicine falls in the same tier as UND and NDSU. Member Volk requested the system office investigate options to improve the pooled fund tiers and process, and to also seek an Attorney General's opinion regarding the language that references the School of Medicine. Chair Beehler asked that the system office investigate some of the changes and recommendations identified for the committee's March meeting, the system office agreed.



North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Fund Rules of Operation & Procedures



A matching grant fund for the advancement of higher education academics.

Introduction

The 63rd legislative assembly initiated a program to enhance North Dakota University System institutions through a matching grant fund. The North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Fund is intended to ignite a philanthropic spirit to support North Dakota colleges and universities. The State Board of Higher Education shall award one dollar in matching grants for every two dollars of non-state, non-federal dollars raised by the institutional foundations of North Dakota public colleges and universities for projects dedicated to the advancement of academics. Distributions of grant awards will be made based upon the review and approval of the legislatively prescribed grant review committee.

The grant review committee consists of the Governor, or the Governor's designee, who serves as the chairman of the committee, two members of the House of Representatives Appropriations Committee, two members appointed by the Governor, and two members appointed by the State Board of Higher Education. A list of the current committee members can be found on the North Dakota University System website under Information Topics or via the link https://ndus.edu/nd-higher-education-challenge-fund/.

Grant review committee meetings will be held as needed, on an approximate quarterly basis, and are subject to applicable North Dakota open meetings and open records laws.

Grant review committee meetings will be convened at the call of the chair and applications will be heard in alphabetic order by institution. An oral presentation to the grant review committee shall be given by the institution's President, or a designee of the institution's President. If the latter, this designation must be expressed in writing and signed by the institution's President expressing his/her full knowledge of the application. Along with the President or the President's designee, an institution can invite any other individual to participate in the presentation of the project to the committee. The grant review committee may make recommendations for reapplication regarding the scope or qualifying components eligible for funding of the project. The State Board of Higher Education shall distribute the funds according to the grant review committee's decisions.

Grant & Project Eligibility

To qualify for a matching grant, an institution's application must be approved by the grant review committee and meet the minimum match threshold: at least \$50,000 for the University of North Dakota and North Dakota State University and at least \$25,000 for the other North Dakota University System institutions and the NDSU Agriculture, Research, and Extension. Eligible match contributions can be from individuals, families, corporations, nonprofits, or dedicated campaigns organized by the respective institutional foundation. In kind donations are not eligible for match contributions. In accordance with N.D.C.C. §15-10-50, if the State Board of Higher Education provides grant funds to an institution, on the basis of a monetary pledge, and if the amount forthcoming is less than the amount pledged, the institutional foundation is liable to the institution for any shortfall. Pledges should not exceed seven years.

Private funds that are designated to be matched by the state may not be leveraged again by public funds. The North Dakota University System Foundation is not eligible for a grant.

Endowed Activity

Donations for an endowed activity are eligible for state matching funds. Donations received by the foundation, but not available for use until the death of the donor, are eligible for state match. State funds may be distributed to the foundation upon receipt of the donation. State funds may be used to fund the endowed activity in advance of the private donor's death.

In the event the donor revokes the donation, the institutional foundation is liable for the shortfall.

Funding Amounts & Timelines

Each biennium funds shall be awarded based on N.D.C.C. § 15-10-48 through 15-10-53. If allocated funding has not been awarded by January 1 of the second year of the biennium, the unused funds will be made available to the respective institutions as outlined later in this document. If the remaining dollars are insufficient to provide a matching grant in the amount of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundation, the Grant Review committee shall award a lesser amount.

The State Board of Higher Education will retain up to one-quarter of one percent of any grant awarded to assist with administrative expenses. This amount will be deducted from each grant as paid.

Application & Review Process

Scope Application

For all non-scholarship projects, the institution must present the project idea or campaign to the grant review committee for scope approval. This is necessary so that fundraising efforts have confidence that the final application will be approved by the committee. Funds will not be obligated at this point in the process. The application must include how the institution will benefit academically from the project and demonstrate community and student support. Project scope approval can be requested at any point during the biennium. Scope approval applications must be submitted by the respective institution's Office of the President to the North Dakota University System office using State Form Number 60559.

Scholarship applications that meet the statutory rules in N.D.C.C. § 15-10-53 do not require scope approval.

Funding Application

Applications for matching dollars must be submitted by the respective institution's Office of the President to the North Dakota University System office, using State Form Number 60473, and be signed by all required parties. Applications can be submitted at any time to the North Dakota University System office. The application must include how the institution will benefit academically from the project, demonstrate community and student support, and provide documentation of cash or monetary pledges received after July 1 of the first year of the biennium. Requests for state awards must be made to the nearest whole dollar.

Qualifying applications for matching dollars that are exclusively dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics include investments in research, scholarships, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in educational infrastructure. Examples of applications that are <u>not</u> exclusively dedicated to the advancement of academics include scholarships intended solely for the benefit of athletics, campus facility repair projects, and new capital construction projects. Additionally, aesthetic landscaping costs are not an eligible expense for grant match.

Educational infrastructure is defined as all resources necessary to develop and deliver educational programming, and support effective teaching and learning, in turn facilitating successful students and instructors; **excluding capital construction or structural renovation projects**. Examples of Educational Infrastructure may include, but are not limited to, the items listed below in Table 1.




Pooled Funding Application Process & Determination

If designated funds have not been awarded to campuses by January 1 of the second year of the biennium the remaining funds are combined into two separate pools which institutions can access. This funding will be defined as "pooled funding." See N.D.C.C. §15-10-48(2) and N.D.C.C. §15-10-49(2) identifying the established pools.




N.D.C.C 15-10-49(2)(c) requires first priority to institutions with the same funding allocation amounts

Applications for pooled dollars will be considered in quarterly funding rounds, in the chronological order in which they are received, and until all funding is depleted. Applications must be submitted by the respective institution's Office of the President to the North Dakota University System office, using State Form Number 60473, and be signed by all required parties. The first application round deadline will be in January of the second year of the biennium.

Application information must include a description of how the institution will benefit academically from the project, demonstrate community and student support, and provide documentation of cash or monetary pledges received after July 1 of the first year of the biennium.

For each biennium, and dependent upon the unique circumstances existing at the time, the granting committee can determine, by a majority vote, the manner in which pooled funding will be awarded. If there is not a majority vote for an alternate method of awarding the pooled funds, the committee will utilize a pro-rata method.

Fund Distribution & Reporting

When the application(s) has been approved by the grant review committee, a memo will be sent from the chair to the Chancellor of the North Dakota University System authorizing the distribution of funds. 100% of the state approved funds less the required administrative fee will be distributed to the institution's Office of the President unless the grant review committee or the institution requests an alternate distribution schedule. A memo of understanding (MOU) between the institution and the institution's foundation must be on file with the North Dakota University System office prior to any distributions. Funds will be distributed from the general fund.

Once the grant awards have been approved, modifications may be made to the project's scope, total financial investment, etc. with approval from the grant review committee.

Each institution must submit semi-annual reports of the collected and distributed funds as of the reporting date to the North Dakota University System office, utilizing State Form Number 60859, and these reports should also be forwarded to the grant review committee. The purpose of these reports is to provide information for the compilation of periodic status updates and accomplishments to the Governor's Office, Interim Committee on Higher Education legislative committee, and State Board of Higher Education. The reports must include a financial status of the project to date as it relates to the Challenge Grant Fund program.

All funds will be subject to the annual North Dakota University System financial audit as well as the Bi-annual North Dakota University System office operational audit conducted by the State Auditor's Office. The results from these audits will be presented to the grant review committee. All funds are subject to state procurement and open records laws.

Rules of Operation & Procedures Document

This document serves as the rules of operations and procedures for the Higher Education Challenge Fund. It has been reviewed and approved by the grant review committee and forwarded to the State Board of Higher Education and legislative management. Any changes to the rules and procedures will require a majority vote of the grant review committee.


Pooled Funding Scenarios:

We have received information back from the Attorney General's (AG) Office regarding the question of whether UND-SMHS and NDSU Agriculture, Research, and Extension entities should be a part of pooled funding. The AG's offices interpretation of NDCC 15-10-48(2) is that UND-SMHS and NDSU Agriculture, Research, and Extension are entities under the umbrellas of UND and NDSU, therefore the UND-SMHS and NDSU Agriculture, Research, and Extension are eligible to apply for any remaining pooled funding for UND, NDSU, and UND-SMHS. The NDSU Agriculture, Research, and Extension initial funding is authorized in NDCC 15-10-48.2 and any unclaimed funding would not be available for pool funding to distribute.

At the December 4, 2023, Challenge Grant meeting, the Committee requested options be presented at its next meeting on how to distribute the pooled funding. Applications for pooled funding will be accepted after the pooled amount is determined based on available funds not awarded by the Grant Review Committee as of January 1 of the odd number year for NDCC 15-10-48 and NDCC 15-10-49 following the same criteria as the original applications and that the Grant Review Committee <u>consider</u> the applications in chronological order. Consider means to think about, or to ponder or study and to examine carefully. Below are the NDCC cites for the pooled funding for the two different pools.

NDCC 15-10-48(2) states (UND, UND SMHS, & NDSU):


- a. If any available dollars have not been awarded by the board before January first of each odd-numbered year, in accordance with subsection 1, either the university of North Dakota or North Dakota state university may apply for an additional matching grant.
- b. An application submitted under this subsection must meet the same criteria as an original application.
- c. The board shall consider each application submitted under this subsection in chronological order.
- d. If the remaining dollars are insufficient to provide a matching grant in the amount of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundation, the board shall award a lesser amount.



NDCC 15-10-49(2) states (BSC, DCB, DSU, MaSU, MiSU, LRSC, NDSCS, VCSU, & WSC):

- a. If any available dollars have not been awarded by the board before January first of each odd-numbered year, in accordance with subsection 1, any institution listed in subsection 1 may apply for an additional matching grant.
- b. An application submitted under this subsection must meet the same criteria as an original application.
- c. The board shall prioritize available dollars allocated in paragraph 1 of subdivision c of subsection 1 to applicants in paragraph 1 of subdivision c of subsection 1. The board shall prioritize available dollars allocated in paragraph 2 of subdivision c of subsection 1 to applicants in paragraph 2 of subdivision c of subsection 1. The board shall prioritize available dollars allocated in paragraph 3 of subdivision c of subsection 1 to applicants in paragraph 3 of subdivision c of subsection 1.
- d. After considering applications pursuant to subdivision c, the board shall consider each application submitted under this subsection in chronological order.

If the remaining dollars are insufficient to provide a matching grant in the amount of one dollar for every two dollars raised by the institutional foundation, the board shall award a lesser amount.



Pooled Funding Scenario Option 1: (Equal distribution for each institution)

Funds remaining in each pool are initially available to be redistributed to institutions in the same pool who utilized all funds. In Option 1, Part 1, Pool 1, Institution 1B and 1C utilized 100% of their allocations and can request the remaining funds that Institution 1A didn't utilize. The split is 50/50 since each institution submitted funding beyond the remaining funds. In Option 1, Pool 2, no funds remain, and no additional allocations are available within Pool 2. In Option 1, Pool 3, Institution 3C didn't utilize 100% of its funding and institutions 3A and 3B did utilize their funding. Institution 3A and Institution 3B have additional requests, but neither exceed the funds remaining. Both requests can be fully awarded to the two institutions, and there is \$40,000 remaining to go into the final allocation process.

In Option 1, Part 2, the remaining \$40,000 is equally divided between the 5 institutions who have requested additional funds from the pool, awarding each of the 5 institutions \$8,000.

Pooled Funding Scenario Option 2a & 2b: (Distribution based on Legislative Allocation to each institution requesting funding)

Option 2a, Part 1, and Option 2b, Part 1, both start the same way as Option 1 by initially awarding requests from institutions in their respective Pools that have funds available for redistribution.

Option 2a, Part 2, has two institutions eligible for additional funds from Pool 1 and three institutions eligible for additional funds from Pool 2. To determine the percentage of remaining funds to distribute to each pool, the number of remaining institutions multiplied by the legislatively approved allocation for each institution is calculated and divided by the total dollar amount of all pool funds for requesting institutions. In the case of Option 2a, Part 2, the two institutions for Pool 1 equal \$3.4 million (51%) and the three institutions for Pool 2 equal \$3.3 million (49%). Then in Part 2a after the 51% and 49% allocations are determined the amount in each pool is distributed equally among the institutions. If an institution had an amount to be awarded less than the equal distributions it would be fully funded, and the other institutions would share equally the remaining funds. Part 2b, determines the 51% and 49% allocations and then is allocated further by institution based on a percent to total of each request from the institution in the respective pools.

Option 2b, Part 2, is the same as above, but provided to demonstrate how the Pool allocations can change depending on what Pool has funds remaining. In the case of Option 2b, Part 2, the three institutions for Pool 1 equal \$5.1 million (70%) and the two institutions for Pool 2 equal \$2.2 million (30%).

Pooled Funding Scenario Option 3: (Distribution based on Legislative Allocation to each grouping (\$1.7M; \$1.1M & \$0.6M)

Option 3, Part 1, start the same way as Option 1 and Option 2a/2b by initially awarding requests from institutions in their respective Pools that have funds available for redistribution.

Option 3, Part 2, determines the Pool allocations of remaining funds based on the Allocation level for institutions in each pool. In Pool 1 each institution was legislatively awarded \$1.7 million (61%) and in Pool 2 each was awarded \$1.1 million (39%). These percentages are what is used to determine the allocation amount to the Pool for distribution regardless of how many institutions are requesting funds from each respective pool. Part 2a and Part 2b of option 3 are the same as Option 2, Part 2a and Part 2b for distribution options.

ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund Semi-Annual Reporting Activity Through December 31, 2023

Introduction

The 63rd legislative assembly initiated a program to enhance North Dakota University System institutions through a matching grant fund for the 2013-2015 biennium. As part of this program, the campuses are required to report semi-annually on the status of the projects that have received matching funds. The following information summarizes this data.

Note that when the program was initiated the related statute read "For purposes of this Act, projects dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics include investments in research, scholarships, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in educational infrastructure, *including new capital construction projects that conform with the university system campus master plan and space utilization study.*" All capital construction awards are included in Educational Infrastructure for the purposes of this report. In the 2015-2017 biennium, the language was reversed to exclude this type of activity from being eligible for award.

Campus Feedback

The campuses are provided an opportunity to describe how the ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund awards have benefitted their institution. Below is the feedback received from each campus for the reporting period ending December 31, 2023.

BSC- Scholarships help attract students to Bismarck State College and help reduce the financial burden on the students. Students receiving a scholarship will feel a lasting connection to BSC and will be more likely to consider giving back in the future. Endowed scholarships are a permanent source of funding for future generations of students.

DCB – Challenge Grants have been instrumental in building scholarship endowment funds for Dakota College at Bottineau over the past decade. Non-endowment match dollars from the Challenge Grant have also been utilized to support numerous students through direct scholarships. Monies given by major donors have been matched to provide much-needed educational infrastructure. We are grateful for the incentive this program provides to donors. The Challenge Grants continue to have a positive impact on student learning across the State.

DSU – The Challenge Grant allowed the DSU Heritage Foundation the opportunity to offer scholarships immediately and have an impact upon our students the same year the Foundation was started. The Challenge Grant provided strong backing to the DSU Heritage Foundation showing all donors the new Foundation was backed by the State of North Dakota. The impact of the match has been seen for the last three years through annual scholarships and will be seen for many more years through the endowment side. Without the Challenge Grant the DSU Heritage Foundation would only be able to offer a fraction of the scholarship currently offered.

LRSC – With continued funding from the North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund, our endowment pool of funding support continues to grow and is now providing more than four hundred students with scholarship support. LRSC programs also receive additional financial support that enhance student learning opportunities. With some of the Challenge Grant funding we have been able to supplement program needs to provide additional capacity in areas such as nursing apprenticeships where the private sector has a desperate workforce shortage and need. The public, students, staff, faculty, and alumni are now more aware of what the North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Match does and how it increases the value of their gift. Donors will inquire of availability of these funds when making their gift.

MaSU – The Challenge Grant has had a huge impact on Mayville State University and its students as it has created the opportunity for additional scholarship assistance for students helping to make the cost of higher education more affordable for them. In addition, it helps to ease the burden of student loan debt, giving graduates a head-start as they begin their new careers and set out to make a difference in our state and in our world. We are profoundly grateful for the Challenge Grant resources that have been allotted to Mayville State University during this biennium.

MiSU – The ND Higher Education Challenge Grant has been extremely beneficial for Minot State University and our students. During the 2021-23 biennium we were able to add fifty-six new endowments with thirty-nine endowments receiving challenge grant support. Donors continue to step forward to take advantage of these matching funds while benefiting students in perpetuity. There is not a better program to assist in limiting student debt. Additionally, the MSU Development Foundation has achieved record breaking fundraising support and continues to pace well in the University's \$50 million EMPOWER capital campaign with \$46.9 million secured. The challenge grant program has been instrumental in this fundraising success.

NDSCS – The ND Challenge Grant provides the NDSCS Foundation an opportunity to increase and grow our current Scholarship and Department funds for NDSCS. We have grown our Endowment by over \$3 million dollars this past year, (even in a low market) and awarded over \$1 million in Scholarships. These gifts and investments have allowed us to provide financial stability for our students through scholarships. Endowments have been added and continue to be an annual source of income for some of our programs. We also have been able to expand and grow our RN program, working toward building a Cadaver Lab, remodeling the Cultural Center, with updated seating and providing high tech state of the art Agriculture Equipment, all because of the Challenge Grant funds. It also helps to fund our Science of Leadership and Ambassador programs. The Challenge grant offers us a wonderful tool encouraging our donors to leave a legacy while they are living and being able to see their gift work. We are so fortunate to have this opportunity and feel it needs to continue to be an avenue for our future fundraising efforts. Thank you to the legislative session for approving more dollars for us to work with over this biennium. We are excited to reach this goal.

NDSU – Philanthropy is a powerful game-changer for those that benefit from its impact, and at North Dakota State University, it is our students that benefit the most. Since the inception of the North Dakota Challenge Grant Program, a large and growing pool of scholarship funds have been established to directly impact undergraduate and graduate students. These resources directly assist students in their ability to obtain a degree from NDSU; for many, the lack of this kind of support would be a barrier to life transformation and making a difference in our society. Scholarships have been established to support students in every area of campus, including all academic programs, performing arts, entrepreneurship initiatives, and leadership programs. This program has also been extremely attractive to benefactors, willing to partner with the state of North Dakota and leverage a partnership for greater impact. We are hopeful for its continued funding and enhanced future impact for students, faculty, and programs at NDSU.

UND - Since its inception in 2013, the public-private partnership that the North Dakota Challenge Grant has created has impacted thousands of students at the University of North Dakota. We have focused our efforts on raising support that impacts strategic priorities of the university as well as college-based initiatives including scholarships, faculty, and academic programs. The University of North Dakota has utilized our entire \$22 million allocation from the state with \$44 million in gifts and commitments. Since the North Dakota Challenge Fund began, four hundred unique donors have funded 251 endowment funds at UND. Two out of every three gifts to the program have come from donors outside the state who want to invest in higher education in the great state of North Dakota.


VCSU – Scholarship gifts insure strong financial support to VCSU's commitment to high academic standards for our students. VCSU prepares students to succeed as educators, leaders, engaged citizens in an increasingly complex and diverse society. The ND Challenge Grant continues to assist VCSU in increasing our scholarship pool and the opportunity to offer renewable scholarships as part of our recruitment and retention of students.

WSC – WSC receives patron endowed scholarships, and with the addition of Challenge Grant funding from the ND State Legislature, WSC can provide scholarship dollars to 88% of its student body. In the 2023-24 school year, students will receive over \$3.6 million in direct scholarship support in the form of regional, non-regional, and housing scholarships, in large part due to the output from the Challenge Grant and other similar endowment and gift campaigns. In addition to scholarships, WSC has also used Challenge Grant dollars for Educational Infrastructure for its Nursing program.

If it were not for the Challenge Grant and other planned giving endowments, the 53-county area of Eastern Montana and Western North Dakota would have students unable to afford or attend college. The Regional Scholarships, through the WSC Foundation and Challenge Grant funding, continue to make WSC an affordable and academically challenging option when planning for college. Thanks to this funding, WSC continues to be the most affordable college in the ND University System in terms of tuition charged to students. Currently, WSC's base-band tuition rate is \$4,138/academic year.

Changes from June 30, 2023

Since the June 30, 2023, reporting date, <u>excluding current biennium activity</u>, an additional \$1.9 million in private donations have been collected by the campus foundations and campus foundations have expended \$2.1 million.





Private Match Donation Pending

According to the North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Fund Rules of Operation & Procedures, in accordance with N.D.C.C §15-10-50, if the State Board of Higher Education provides grant funds to an institution, based on a monetary pledge, and if the amount forthcoming is less than the amount pledged, the institutional foundation is liable to the institution for any shortfall. Pledges should not exceed seven years.

Institutions with private match donations pending from the 2013-2015 biennium reached the specified sevenyear deadline as of January 31, 2022. The information was reviewed at the June 24, 2022, ND HE Challenge Grant Committee meeting. There was \$368,779 in private donations pending from six different Institutions. The committee reviewed and approved the Institution provided timelines for when the donations were to be collected in full. The table below lists the private match remaining from the 2013-15 biennium as of the date of this report.

Introduction

According to the North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Fund Rules of Operation & Procedures, in accordance with N.D.C.C §15-10-50, if the State Board of Higher Education provides grant funds to an institution, based on a monetary pledge, and if the amount forthcoming is less than the amount pledged, the institutional foundation is liable to the institution for any shortfall. Pledges should not exceed seven years.

As of January 31, 2024, Institutions with private match donations pending from the 2015-2017 biennium would now have reached the specified seven-year deadline. This report captures the private match donation pending by campus, as of January 31, 2024.





Campus Comments:

Bismarck State College (BSC):

The \$316,867 that remains uncollected in private donation match from the 2015-17 biennium consists of two donations of \$176,694 and \$140,172. Each donation is a bequest, and the donors are still living.

Dickinson State University (DSU):

The \$500 that remains uncollected in private donation match from the 2015-17 biennium is an uncollectable amount from the donor and the DSU Heritage Foundation will fulfill the final pledge payment as of February 14, 2024.

Mayville State University (MaSU):

The \$675,337 that remains uncollected in private donation match from the 2015-17 biennium consists of two donations of \$640,000 and \$35,337. The \$640,000 is an Annuity Death Benefit and the donor is still living. The \$35,337 is an estate gift and the donor is still living.

Minot State University (MiSU):

The \$20,000 that remains uncollected in private donation match from the 2015-17 biennium consists of one donation. This is a single gift payable upon death benefit proceeds pursuant to an irrevocable life insurance designation naming Minot State University Development Foundation as the Beneficiary. This donor is still living.
