6. **DSU Tuition Exemption Request**

After discussing individual tuition exemption requests for specific programs at UND and DSU, the committee agreed that there is a need for a system-wide approach to administering tuition exemptions; it will be a future Budget and Finance Committee agenda item. Chair Black requested the system office work with campuses and create a matrix identifying current approved tuition exemptions at each campus, along with a brief explanation of the need for an exemption.

7. **DSU Generator Project Request**

11. VCSU Center for the Arts Renaming

12. VCSU 2021-23 Tier II/III Capital Building Funds Request

Biller, Mihalick, and Black voted yes. By α and Volk absent. Motion passed 3-0.

13. BSC Request to Rename LEA Hall

Dr. Larry C. Skogen was the sixth president of Bismarck State College and served the institution from 2007 to 2020. Century Code 15-10-74 directs that the new polytechnic facility will be named the Larry C. Skogen Polytechnic Institute. Dr. Jensen reported that Dr. Skogen's preference is to name the Library, English, and Arts Hall (LEA) in his honor. Representative Martinson supports Dr. Skogen's preference and will address CC 15-10-74 next legislative session.

Biller moved, Mihalick seconded, to recommend approval of <u>BSC's request to rename</u> LEA Hall, as presented.

Biller, Mihalick, and Black voted yes. Bye and Volk absent. Motion passed 3 – 0.

14. BSC Joint Powers Agreement

The Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) authorizes BSC to develop a multi-purpose community facility with the Bismarck Public School District No. 1 and the Bismarck Parks and Recreation District. The JPA will govern the design, planning, development, funding, maintenance, usage, and operation of a multi-purpose community facility located on the campus of Bismarck State College (BSC). The facility will be known as the Bismarck Community Bowl.

Biller moved, Mihalick seconded, to recommend approval of BSC's <u>Joint Powers</u> <u>Agreement</u>, as presented.

Biller, Mihalick, and Black voted yes. Bye and Volk absent. Motion passed 3 – 0.
