ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund Semi-Annual Reporting Activity Through June 30, 2024

Introduction

The 63rd legislative assembly initiated a program to enhance North Dakota University System institutions through a matching grant fund for the 2013-2015 biennium. As part of this program, the campuses must report semi-annually on the status of projects that have received matching funds. The following information summarizes this data.

Note that when the program was initiated the related statute read "For purposes of this Act, projects dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics include investments in research, scholarships, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in educational infrastructure, *including new capital construction projects that conform with the university system campus master plan and space utilization study.*" All capital construction awards are included in the Educational Infrastructure for this report. In the 2015-2017 biennium, the language was reversed to exclude this type of activity from being eligible for award.

Campus Feedback

The campuses are provided an opportunity to describe how the ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund awards have benefitted their institution. Below is the feedback received from each campus for the reporting period ending June 30, 2024.

BSC- Scholarships help attract students to Bismarck State College and help reduce the financial burden on the students. Students receiving a scholarship will feel a lasting connection to BSC and are more likely to consider giving back in the future. Endowed scholarships are a permanent source of funding for future generations of students.

DCB – The North Dakota Challenge Grant fund provides a remarkable impact for the students and programs at Dakota College at Bottineau. We have expanded our scholarship programs, reaching over 250 students annually who receive financial assistance. The support has provided essential equipment and hands-on learning experiences for our students. The nursing and agriculture programs have acquired much needed equipment for student education. Donors and alumni are thrilled to learn that their contributions can be matched up to 50 %. Many alumni have consistently donated to their endowed scholarship funds, thanks to the ND Challenge Grant.

DSU – The Challenge Grant allowed the DSU Heritage Foundation the opportunity to offer scholarships immediately and have an impact upon our students the same year the Foundation was started. The Challenge Grant provided strong backing to the DSU Heritage Foundation showing all donors the new Foundation was backed by the State of North Dakota. The impact of the match has been seen for the last three years through annual scholarships and will be seen for many more years through the endowment side. Without the Challenge Grant the DSU Heritage Foundation would only be able to offer a fraction of the scholarship currently offered.

LRSC – The North Dakota Challenge Grant fund continues to influence Lake Region State College in so many positive ways. With the grant, we have been able to grow our endowment and scholarship programs to ensure that over 400 students per academic year receive scholarship assistance. We believe this has a significant impact and feel privileged to celebrate this. Our program support endowments have been able to provide necessary equipment and hands on learning experiences for our students that will prepare them for the job market. Specifically, our nursing and automotive programs have been fortunate to acquire much needed equipment for student education. We have also seen greater community awareness of the Challenge Grant program, and many donors will ask if funds are available before donating.

MaSU – The Challenge Grant has had an enormous impact on Mayville State University and its students as it has created the opportunity for additional scholarship assistance for students helping to make the cost of higher education more affordable for them. In addition, it helps to ease the burden of student loan debt, giving graduates a head-start as they begin their new careers and set out to make a difference in our state and in our world. We are grateful for the Challenge Grant resources allotted to Mayville State University during this biennium.

MiSU – The ND Higher Education Challenge Grant has been extremely beneficial for Minot State University and our students. During the 2021-23 biennium, we added fifty-six new endowments with thirty-nine endowments receiving challenge grant support. Donors continue to step forward to take advantage of these matching funds while benefiting students in perpetuity. There is not a better program to assist in limiting student debt. Additionally, the MSU Development Foundation has achieved record breaking fundraising support and continues to pace well in the University's \$50 million EMPOWER capital campaign. The challenge grant program has been instrumental in this fundraising success.

NDSCS – NDSCS has raised \$11,883,792 for state match of \$5,800,782 over the past ten years. This tool has made a tremendous impact on all programs at NDSCS. Everything from Machine Tooling, Nursing, Diesel, Power Sports, Welding, Leadership programs, the Science and Math departments to Performing Arts, Architecture, Land Surveying, Culinary, Precision Machining, HVAC, and more. We have added over 24 new scholarship endowments and added close to 50 of our current endowments. The Challenge Grant has provided over \$300,000 toward leadership scholarships and over \$2 million in equipment needs and one-time projects. This has been one of the best tools for us to use to raise funds for the college and complete our mission to aid in helping the college grow. We thank the state of North Dakota for taking the chance on this project and seeing it as a positive for the college to advance on so many levels.

NDSU – Philanthropy is a powerful game-changer for those that benefit from its impact, and at North Dakota State University, it is our students that benefit the most. Since the inception of the North Dakota Challenge Grant Program, a large and growing pool of scholarship funds have been established to directly impact undergraduate and graduate students.

These resources directly assist students in their ability to obtain a degree from NDSU; for many, the lack of this kind of support would be a barrier to life transformation and making a difference in our society. Scholarships have been established to support students in every area of campus, including all academic programs, performing arts, entrepreneurship initiatives, and leadership programs. This program has also been extremely attractive to benefactors, willing to partner with the state of North Dakota and leverage a partnership for greater impact. We are hopeful for its continued funding and enhanced future impact for students, faculty, and programs at NDSU.


UND - Since its inception in 2013, the public-private partnership that the North Dakota Challenge Grant has created has impacted thousands of students at the University of North Dakota. We have focused on raising support that impacts strategic priorities of the university and college-based initiatives including scholarships, faculty, and academic programs. Prior to the most recent allocation granted by the legislature in 2023 the University of North Dakota has utilized our entire \$22 million allocation from the state with \$44 million in gifts and commitments. Since the North Dakota Challenge Fund began, over 400 unique donors have funded 263 endowment funds at UND. Two out of every three gifts to the program have come from donors outside the state who want to invest in higher education in the great state of North Dakota.

VCSU – The ND Challenge Grant continues to help VCSU increase our scholarship pool and offer renewable scholarships as part of our recruitment and retention of students.

WSC – In the 2023-24 school year, students received over \$3.6 million in direct scholarship support in the form of regional, non-regional, and housing scholarships, in large part due to the output from the Challenge Grant and other similar endowment and gift campaigns. Williston State College uses matching funds from the Challenge Grant to support student scholarships, and during this past academic, to support academic infrastructure for WSC's Nursing Program. It is safe to say that, were it not for the Challenge Grant and other planned giving endowments, the 53-county area of Eastern Montana and Western North Dakota would have students unable to afford to attend college. The Regional Scholarships, through the WSC Foundation and Challenge Grant funding, continue to make WSC an affordable and academically challenging option when planning for college. Thanks to this funding, WSC continues to be the most affordable college in the ND University System in terms of tuition charged to students. Currently, WSC's base-band tuition rate is \$4,138/academic year.

Changes from December 31, 2023

Since the December 31, 2023, reporting date, <u>excluding current biennium activity</u>, an additional \$1.1 million in private donations have been collected by the campus foundations and campus foundations have expended an additional \$660,000.



Private Match Donation Pending-Pledges Due Update


According to the North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Fund Rules of Operation & Procedures, in accordance with N.D.C.C §15-10-50, if the State Board of Higher Education provides grant funds to an institution, based on a monetary pledge, and if the amount forthcoming is less than the amount pledged, the institutional foundation is liable to the institution for any shortfall. Pledges should not exceed seven years.

Institutions with private match donations pending from the 2013-15 biennium reached the specified seven-year deadline as of January 31, 2022. The information was reviewed at the June 24, 2022, ND HE Challenge Grant Committee meeting. There was \$368,779 in private donations pending from six different Institutions. The committee reviewed and approved the Institution provided timelines for when the donations were to be collected in full. The table below lists the private match remaining from the 2013-15 biennium as of this report's date.






