CHOOSING THE RIGHT COLLEGE FOR YOU

The North Dakota University System includes two-year colleges and four-year universities. While each campus is unique in size and the types of programs it offers, the bullet points below describe North Dakota's public colleges and universities in general terms.

TWO-YEAR COLLEGES ..

- Offer career and technical programs that prepare you for a specific career. When you complete a technical program, you will receive a certificate, an associate in arts (AA) degree or an associate in applied science (AAS) degree, any of which will enable you to directly enter the workforce in your particular field of study. Some programs take less than two years to complete.
- Offer associate in arts (AA) and associate in science (AS) degrees; either degree may meet your educational goals or prepare you to transfer to a four-year university.
- Have open enrollment policies; they accept all high school graduates and general educational development (GED) recipients, but require students to take the ACT test.

FOUR-YEAR UNIVERSITIES ..

- Offer a broad range of programs and degrees, including four-year or bachelor's degrees; some also offer graduate degrees, such as master's degrees and doctorates.
- May offer a limited number of technical programs.
- Require students to meet admission requirements, including taking core high school courses and the ACT test with a minimum score. Some also accept SAT test results.

WHAT ARE CORE COURSES?

Core courses are those required for admission to a four-year university in the North Dakota University System.

English: Four courses

Mathematics: Three courses (algebra 1 and above)

Laboratory science: Three courses (including at least two in biology, chemistry, physics or physical science)

Social studies: Three courses (not including consumer education, cooperative marketing, orientation to social science and marriage/family) NDUS recommends that students take a mathematics course each year of high school, including advanced algebra.

Additional courses may be required before you can be admitted to some college programs.

A student who has not taken the required courses is welcome to attend any of the state's two-year colleges. Upon satisfactory completion of 24 credits, the student will be eligible to transfer to a four-year university.

Your school counselor can help you find out more about the specific requirements for the programs that interest you. These course requirements will increase to 15 core courses by Fall 2018 for admission to the research universities – North Dakota State University and University of North Dakota.

EARN HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE CREDIT AT THE SAME TIME!

As a high school sophomore, junior or senior, you may be able to take dual-credit and advanced placement (AP) courses. These courses meet high school graduation requirements, plus they may help you get an early start on college classes. If your high school and an area college have an agreement to offer dual-credit courses, ask a high school counselor to help you determine if you're academically ready for college. You may end up on the fast track for a college degree.

GRADE-POINT AVERAGE – WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL?

A high grade-point average helps you gain admittance to the college or university of your choice. Plus, a good GPA may make you eligible for college scholarships. Your GPA will be one factor considered for acceptance at a college or university.

The four-year universities are broken down into three categories, each with its own minimum requirements for admission. 2.0 is the minimum GPA required by the regional universities (Dickinson State University, Mayville State University and Valley City State University). 2.75 is the minimum GPA required by the master's university (Minot State University) and the research universities (North Dakota State University and the University of North Dakota).

EARN A \$6,000 COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

The North Dakota Legislature created scholarships for high school graduates, the North Dakota Academic Scholarship, the N.D Career and Technical Education Scholarship, and the N.D. Scholarship. These programs reward North Dakota high school graduates who meet specific coursework, grade-point-average and test score requirements. If you qualify, you may be eligible for up to \$6,000 for undergraduate study at eligible institutions of higher education within North Dakota. Your high school counselor can work with you to make sure you're taking the right steps to qualify for one of these scholarships. A HIGH GRADE-POINT AVERAGE HELPS YOU GAIN ADMITTANCE TO THE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY OF YOUR CHOICE.



PLAN AHEAD – NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM GIVES YOU MORE OPTIONS

It's not too early to begin charting your career path. But what if you choose a college and major, then begin college and change your mind? Many college courses transfer with you from one North Dakota University System college or university to another. In fact, systemwide agreements guarantee the transfer of all general education courses.

WHY TAKE THE ACT?

All students who plan to attend a public college or university in North Dakota are required to take the ACT Assessment. As a North Dakota high school student, you will take the ACT during your junior year. NDUS colleges and universities use ACT scores as a tool for determining admission (at four-year universities) and eligibility for scholarships. For more information, contact your school counselor or visit the ACT website at: act.org. When taken at your school during your junior year, ACT costs are covered by the state.

The SAT test is another form of assessment used in some other states. SAT results also are accepted by NDUS colleges and universities.




