The Bismarck State College Foundation is duly incorporated as a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of North Dakota to be operated exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including, but not limited to, the managing of endowment assets for the benefit of Bismarck State College, and is authorized to receive gifts and bequests, and to make contracts of investment, sales and disposition.

The name of this endowment shall be the the Endowment Fund. This endowment is
established with a direct gift from the Donor to the Foundation. The direct gift hereby made is declared to
be irrevocable for the purpose of establishing an endowment. The Donor or any other persons may, at any
time, either with a direct or deferred gift arrangement, make additional contributions to the Foundation to
be added to the Endowment Fund. The assets of this endowment shall be held in
perpetuity by the Foundation.


Distribution will commence when the fund reaches \$25,000 in contributions/earnings. A distribution from this fund shall be made for the purpose of supporting BSC's carpentry, HVAC and other technical programs and scholarships per the established guidelines.

Distributions will be made at the discretion of the Foundation Board of Trustees and shall be for purposes identified in this Agreement. Such purposes shall fall within the funding purposes identified in the Bylaws of the Foundation. If the purposes identified in this Agreement no longer exist, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall first work with the Donor to establish a new purpose. If the Donor is not living or capable of making a change of purpose, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall endeavor to distribute funds at the annual distribution rate for a purpose that is as close as possible to the original purpose of the endowment.

No part of the corpus or net income of this endowment shall be diverted from exclusively educational purposes. It is specifically agreed that any endowment losses must be applied against the value of this endowment and not against the net unrestricted assets of the Foundation. It is the intention of this Agreement that the gifted funds shall be managed as an endowment fund subject to the *North Dakota Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act* and/or any amendments. The Foundation hereby agrees to faithfully administer this endowment in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota,

We pledge to the Bismarck State College Foundation a gift of \$350,000 over 7 years. Funds received by the BSC Foundation will be designated to the Endowment Fund.

to the Foundation to be added to the Scholarship Endowment Fund. The assets o
this endowment shall be held in perpetuity by the Foundation.

Distribution will commence when the fund reaches \$20,000 in contributions/earnings. A distribution from this fund shall be made for the purpose of supporting scholarships per the established guidelines.


Distributions will be made at the discretion of the Foundation Board of Trustees and shall be for purposes identified in this Agreement. Such purposes shall fall within the funding purposes identified in the Bylaws of the Foundation. If the purposes identified in this Agreement no longer exist, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall first work with the Donor to establish a new purpose. If the Donor is not living or capable of making a change of purpose, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall endeavor to distribute funds at the annual distribution rate for a purpose that is as close as possible to the original purpose of the endowment.

No part of the corpus or net income of this endowment shall be diverted from exclusively educational purposes. It is specifically agreed that any endowment losses must be applied against the value of this endowment and not against the net unrestricted assets of the Foundation. It is the intention of this Agreement that the gifted funds shall be managed as an endowment fund subject to the *North Dakota Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act* and/or any amendments. The Foundation hereby agrees to faithfully administer this endowment in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.

CCF ND TAX CREDIT ENDOWMENT FUND GIFT AGREEMENT

This Endowment Gift Agreement is made by and between ("Donor") and Lake Region Community College Foundation of Devils Lake, North Dakota ("CCF").

- 1. Pursuant to this Agreement, Donor has pledged and will irrevocably transfer to CCF the sum of \$44,000.00 (US dollars), receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by CCF, subject, however, to all the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- 2. The assets described above are given by Donor to CCF to add a permanent, irrevocable endowment fund the name of which is the **Robert and Carol Leevers Scholarship Endowment** (the "Endowment Fund"). Consistent with the terms of the Endowment Fund Operating Guidelines and Policies and applicable laws then in effect, CCF may appropriate for expenditure or accumulate so much of the Endowment Fund as CCF determines is prudent for the uses, benefits, purposes, and duration for which the Endowment Fund is established. The Endowment Fund's spending policy, as set forth in the Operating Guidelines and Policies, shall allow for distributions from the Endowment Fund at an initially established annual range of 3% to 6%. Such annual distributions or payouts from the Endowment Fund will be restricted in their use to providing financial support of the specifically expressed charitable purposes and mission of CCF, subject to the further guidelines set forth in the Endowment Fund Operating Guidelines and Policies.
- 3. This Endowment Fund shall be operated in accordance with the Endowment Fund Operating Guidelines and Policies which have been established by CCF and which are in accordance with Chapter 59-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, captioned Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act ("UPMIFA"), as may be amended from time to time in the future.
- 4. The undersigned Donor, acting either as an individual or through its authorized officer or representative, has received a copy of such Guidelines and Policies and, by signing this Agreement, indicates that the Donor has read and understood them.
- 5. The gift will be used to support <u>scholarships</u> for exemplary students at Lake Region State College. Additional criteria to consider in recipient selection includes:
- 6. The Board of Directors of CCF may release or modify a restriction contained in the Gift Agreement, in whole or in part, if CCF first obtains the Donor's consent to the release or modification. If the Donor is unable to consent to the release or modification and, further, if the restriction has become impracticable, wasteful, or unlawful, if it impairs the management or investment of the Endowment Fund, or if, because of circumstances not anticipated by the Donor, a modification of the restriction will further the purposes of the Endowment Fund, then in such event the Board of Directors may release or modify the restrictions in a manner consistent with the expressed charitable purposes and mission of CCF.

- 7. This is the only endowment agreement with respect to this endowment gift by Donor. Any changes to the terms of this Agreement must be in writing, agreed to and signed by both the Donor and CCF. In no case will such change alter the permanent, irrevocable nature of the Donor's gift or the qualifying status of the Fund, to allow the Donor to receive the North Dakota income tax credit.
- 8. This gift by Donor is irrevocable and is intended to qualify for charitable deductions under Internal Revenue Code section 170, 2522 or 2055, as applicable. If the Donor is a North Dakota tax paying permitted business entity of individual, this gift is further intended to qualify for the endowment tax credit provided for in Section 57-38-01.21, as amended and reenacted, of the North Dakota Century Code.
- 9. The CCF, as Trustee of this endowment, shall be entitled to compensation for services here-in-under according to the Trustee's schedule of fees in effect at the time such services are rendered.
- 10. Donor agrees to allow CCF to recognize Donor's gift to the Endowment Fund in CCF's newsletters, catalogs, annual reports, press releases, and the like. If Donor desires that this gift remain ANONYMOUS (except within the internal records of CCF), please check the following block: □
- 11. This Gift Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of North Dakota.

(hereinafter

Endowment" (hereinafter referred to as the Fund) for the benefit of Minot State University. The Minot State University Development Foundation wishes to express its deepest appreciation and gratitude to the donor for their generosity and interest in establishing this endowment fund.

The Fund will be established with proceeds from the estate of funds through the ND Higher Education Challenge Grant program. It is the donor's intent that a portion of the bequest qualify for matching funds through the ND State Higher Education Challenge Grant program. A request of \$50,000 in matching funds will be submitted at the December 2020 ND Challenge Grant meeting. These matching funds will allow MSU to initiate the scholarship endowment upon receipt of the Challenge Grant match. It is understood that only the allocations from this Fund shall be awarded each year for purposes as designated in this Agreement. This endowment shall be held in perpetuity, and monies in this special account may be commingled with other funds for investment purposes, and in a manner consistent with state law. Investments shall be made in a prudent fashion, and in keeping with the Foundation's established investment policies and procedures.

The investment goals of the MSU Development Foundation are to attain a total rate of return which provides for long-term growth in the endowment, to keep pace with future inflation, thereby preserving the Fund's original purchasing power. 



If presently unforeseen circumstances should arise which make it impossible for the College to use fund earnings for the purposes outlined above, the college shall redirect earnings to program(s) at the college which most closely parallel the donor(s) original interests and intent.
- 7. The Alumni Foundation shall be entitled to reasonable compensation for services rendered in the management of the Endowment. Any future gifts will be subject to the fee policy in place at such time. This fee is currently eight percent. The fund and all accounting of the fund will be subject to these guidelines.

ENDOWMENT AGREEMENT



Endowment

1. DONOR AND ENDOWMENT:

hereinafter referred to as "the Donors", desiring to support the ongoing growth and development of the University of North Dakota ("the University"), hereby establish the

Endowment ("the Fund") within the UND Alumni Association and Foundation ("the Foundation"). It is the intent of the Donors to make periodic contributions to the Fund until the aggregate amount of such contributions ("the contribution total") reaches the minimum amount required for the Fund to be administered as an endowment according to the Foundation's gift acceptance policy ("the minimum amount"). Until the contribution total reaches the minimum amount (\$25,000), no annual allocations shall be distributed from the Fund, and the Foundation shall have discretion as to whether and how to invest the assets of the Fund. At such time as the contribution total reaches the minimum amount, the Fund shall be administered as an endowment by the Foundation according to the following provisions of this Agreement. If the contribution total has not reached the minimum amount within five years after the initial contribution to it, however, the Foundation shall combine the Fund with a similar existing endowment or spend for the purposes designated.

- 2. PURPOSE: When the contribution total reaches the minimum amount and the Fund becomes an endowment, the Foundation shall distribute allocations from the Fund each year for one or more scholarships for medical students at the University of North Dakota.
- PAYOUT POLICY: The Foundation shall determine the annual allocation from the Fund in accordance with the Foundation's endowment spending policy, as adopted by its Board of Directors ("the Board").
- 4. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: When the Fund becomes an endowment, the Foundation shall commingle the assets of the Fund with the Foundation's other endowments and manage the Fund's assets as part of the Foundation's investment portfolio, if the Foundation has not already done so. That investment portfolio is part of the annual audit of the Foundation conducted by an independent public accounting firm as approved by the Foundation's Audit Committee and the Board. That portfolio shall be managed in accordance with the investment policy adopted by the Board. The Foundation shall be entitled to compensation from the Fund for services rendering in administering the Fund according to the Foundation's schedule of fees in effect at the time such services are rendered.



Endowment

The Fund, all contributions to it, and its administration shall be governed by the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, N.D. Cent. Code Chapter 59-21 ("UPMIFA"). The Fund constitutes an "institutional fund" within the meaning of UPMIFA. The Fund is not a trust. All contributions to the Fund are irrevocable, and the Foundation shall not return any such contribution under any circumstances.

- **5. ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION:** The Donors or other persons may, at any time, by means of outright or deferred gifts, make additional contributions to the Foundation to be added to the Fund.
- **6. PUBLICITY:** The Donors agree that the Foundation may publicize the creation of the Fund and the use of annual allocations from it.
- 7. AGREEMENT MODIFICATION: If a change in circumstances makes the use of the Fund designated by the Donors in this Agreement inapplicable, obsolete, inappropriate, impracticable, or not in the best interests of the Foundation or the University, the Board, in consultation with appropriate University personnel, may designate an alternative use of the Fund that reflects as closely as practical the Donors' original intent.
- 8. ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT: For purposes of UPMIFA, this Agreement constitutes the entire "gift instrument" with respect to the Fund, contributions to it and its administration, and this Agreement supersedes all prior communications, statements and understandings, whether oral or written, expressed or implied, between the Foundation, the Donors and any other persons with respect to the Fund, contributions to it, and its administration.

Endowment

1. DONOR AND ENDOWMENT:

, and the

, hereinafter referred to as "the Donors", desiring to support the ongoing growth and development of the University of North Dakota ("the University"), hereby establish the Endowment ("the Fund") within the UND Alumni Association and Foundation ("the Foundation"). It is the intent of the Donors to make periodic contributions to the Fund until the aggregate amount of such contributions ("the contribution total") reaches the minimum amount required for the Fund to be administered as an endowment according to the Foundation's gift acceptance policy ("the minimum amount"). Until the contribution total reaches the minimum amount (\$25,000), no annual allocations shall be distributed from the Fund, and the Foundation shall have discretion as to whether and how to invest the assets of the Fund. At such time as the contribution total reaches the minimum amount, the Fund shall be administered as an endowment by the Foundation according to the following provisions of this Agreement. If the contribution total has not reached the minimum amount within five years after the initial contribution to it, however, the Foundation shall combine the Fund with a similar existing endowment or spend for the purposes designated.

- 2. PURPOSE: The Foundation shall distribute allocations from the Fund each year for programming at the School of Medicine and Health Sciences in an effort to improve the lives of Parkinson's Disease patients. Programming will include, but not be limited to: Physical, occupational, and speech therapy education programs; research; workforce development opportunities for students or professionals; and symposiums related to the research, treatment, and care of Parkinson's disease for practitioners, patients, and their families.
- PAYOUT POLICY: The Foundation shall determine the annual allocation from the Fund in accordance with the Foundation's endowment spending policy, as adopted by its Board of Directors ("the Board").
- 4. ENDOWMENT MANAGEMENT: When the Fund becomes an endowment, the Foundation shall commingle the assets of the Fund with the Foundation's other endowments and manage the Fund's assets as part of the Foundation's investment portfolio, if the Foundation has not already done so. That investment portfolio is part of the annual audit of the Foundation conducted by an independent

public accounting firm as approved by the Foundation's Audit Committee and the Board. That portfolio shall be managed in accordance with the investment policy adopted by the Board.

The Foundation shall be entitled to compensation from the Fund for services rendered in administering the Fund according to the Foundation's schedule of fees in effect at the time such services are rendered.

The Fund, all contributions to it, and its administration shall be governed by the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, N.D. Cent. Code Chapter 59-21 ("UPMIFA"). The Fund constitutes an "institutional fund" within the meaning of UPMIFA. The Fund is not a trust. All contributions to the Fund are irrevocable, and the Foundation shall not return any such contribution under any circumstances.

- **5. ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTION:** The Donors or other persons may, at any time, by means of outright or deferred gifts, make additional contributions to the Foundation to be added to the Fund.
- **6. PUBLICITY:** The Donors agree that the Foundation may publicize the creation of the Fund and the use of annual allocations from it.
- 7. AGREEMENT MODIFICATION: If a change in circumstances makes the use of the Fund designated by the Donors in this Agreement inapplicable, obsolete, inappropriate, impracticable, or not in the best interests of the Foundation or the University, the Board, in consultation with appropriate University personnel, may designate an alternative use of the Fund that reflects as closely as practical the Donors' original intent.
- 8. ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT: For purposes of UPMIFA, this Agreement constitutes the entire "gift instrument" with respect to the Fund, contributions to it and its administration, and this Agreement supersedes all prior communications, statements and understandings, whether oral or written, expressed or implied, between the Foundation, the Donors and any other persons with respect to the Fund, contributions to it, and its administration.



Endowment

1. Donor and Endowment:

hereinafter referred

to as "the Donor", desiring to support the ongoing growth and development of the University of North Dakota ("the University"), hereby establishes the

Endowment ("the Fund") within the University of North Dakota Foundation ("the Foundation").

It is the intent of the Donor to make periodic contributions to the Fund until the aggregate amount of such contributions ("the contribution total") reaches the minimum amount required for the Fund to be administered as an endowment according to the Foundation's gift acceptance policy ("the minimum amount"). Until the contribution total reaches the minimum amount (\$25,000), no annual allocations shall be distributed from the Fund, and the Foundation shall have discretion as to whether and how to invest the assets of the Fund. At such time as the contribution total reaches the minimum amount, the Fund shall be administered as an endowment by the Foundation according to the following provisions of this Agreement. If the contribution total has not reached the minimum amount within five years after the initial contribution to it, however, the Foundation shall combine the Fund with a similar existing endowment or spend for the purposes designated.

- 2. Purpose: When the contribution total reaches the minimum amount and the Fund becomes an endowment, the Foundation shall distribute allocations from the Fund each year for one or more scholarships to medical students with preference given to those with financial need.
- 3. Payout Policy: The Foundation shall determine the annual allocation from the Fund in accordance with the Foundation's endowment spending policy, as adopted by its Board of Directors ("the Board").
- 4. Endowment Management: When the Fund becomes an endowment, the Foundation shall commingle the assets of the Fund with the Foundation's other endowments and manage the Fund's assets as part of the Foundation's investment portfolio, if the Foundation has not already done so. That investment portfolio is part of the annual audit of the Foundation conducted by an independent public accounting firm as approved by the Foundation's Audit

Committee and the Board. That portfolio shall be managed in accordance with the investment policy adopted by the Board.

The Foundation shall be entitled to compensation from the Fund for services rendering in administering the Fund according to the Foundation's schedule of fees in effect at the time such services are rendered.

The Fund, all contributions to it, and its administration shall be governed by the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, N.D. Cent. Code Chapter 59-21 ("UPMIFA"). The Fund constitutes an "institutional fund" within the meaning of UPMIFA. The Fund is not a trust. All contributions to the Fund are irrevocable, and the Foundation shall not return any such contribution under any circumstances.

- 5. Additional Contribution: The Donor or other persons may, at any time, by means of outright or deferred gifts, make additional contributions to the Foundation to be added to the Fund.
- 6. **Publicity:** The Donor agrees that the Foundation may publicize the creation of the Fund and the use of annual allocations from it.
- 7. Agreement Modification: If a change in circumstances makes the use of the Fund designated by the Donor in this Agreement inapplicable, obsolete, inappropriate, impracticable, or not in the best interests of the Foundation or the University, the Board, in consultation with appropriate University personnel, may designate an alternative use of the Fund that reflects as closely as practical the Donor's original intent.
- 8. Acceptance of Agreement: For purposes of UPMIFA, this Agreement constitutes the entire "gift instrument" with respect to the Fund, contributions to it and its administration, and this Agreement supersedes all prior communications, statements and understandings, whether oral or written, expressed or implied, between the Foundation, the Donor and any other persons with respect to the Fund, contributions to it, and its administration.

ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund Semi-Annual Reporting Activity Through June 30, 2022

Introduction

The 63rd legislative assembly initiated a program to enhance North Dakota University System institutions through a matching grant fund for the 2013-2015 biennium. As part of this program, the campuses are required to report semi-annually on the status of the projects that have received matching funds. The following information summarizes this data.

Note that when the program was initiated the related statute read "For purposes of this Act, projects dedicated to the advancement of enhanced academics include investments in research, scholarships, technology, endowed chairs, and investments in educational infrastructure, *including new capital construction projects that conform with the university system campus master plan and space utilization study.*" All capital construction awards are included in Educational Infrastructure for the purposes of this report. In the 2015-2017 biennium, the language was reversed to exclude this type of activity from being eligible for award.

Campus Feedback

The campuses are provided an opportunity to describe how the ND Higher Education Challenge Grant Fund awards have benefitted the institution. Below is feedback received for reporting period ending June 30, 2022.

BSC - Scholarships help attract students to Bismarck State College and can reduce a student's cost of tuition by twenty-five percent or more. Scholarships are a reward for a student's hard work and good grades in high school or their freshman year at BSC. Students are encouraged to maintain credit hours and good grades to remain eligible for scholarship funding. The student will feel a lasting connection to BSC and will be more likely to consider giving back in the future. Endowed scholarships are a permanent source of funding for future generations of students.

DCB – The Challenge Grant program works as a positive tool for fundraising for the Dakota College at Bottineau Foundation. We have many donors who know about the program and are excited to know that their donation can be matched up to 50%. Several alumni have opted to donate repeatedly to their endowed scholarship funds because of this program.

DSU - The Challenge Grant allowed the DSU Heritage Foundation the opportunity to offer scholarships immediately and have an impact upon our students the same year the foundation was started. The Challenge Grant provided strong backing to the DSU Heritage Foundation showing all donors the State of North Dakota backed the foundation. The impact of the match has been seen for the last three years through annual scholarships and will be seen for many more years through the endowment side. Without the Challenge Grant the DSU Heritage Foundation would only be able to offer a fraction of the scholarships currently offered.

LRSC – The impact of the North Dakota Higher Education challenge Grant Fund has been immense. The Named Endowment Program at LRSC has grown substantially. We currently have over two hundred endowments with over 50% of them being provided with funding help through the Challenge Grant Fund. In addition to the many new endowments received, many donors have been inspired to boost the size of endowments that were already established. In FY21, funding from theses endowments and other sources provided scholarships totaling over \$450,000 for more than three hundred students. Program endowments continue to provide funding for instructional program enhancements. The funding provided program support has enabled our faculty to continuously improve student learning outcomes. Programs such as the Dakota Nursing Program, Automotive Technology, Wind Energy Technician, Simulator Technology, American Sign Language and Interpreting Studies, and Precision Agriculture are utilizing new and improved technology. The recently completed learning commons and auditorium/lecture bowl have also both received technology updates.

MaSU - The Challenge Grant has had a significant impact on Mayville State University and its students as it has created the opportunity for additional scholarship assistance for students, helping, to make the cost of higher education more affordable for them. In addition, it helps to ease the burden of student loan debt, giving graduates a head-start as they begin their new careers and set out to be effective in our state and in our world. We are profoundly grateful for the challenge grant resources that have been allotted to Mayville State University during this biennium.

MiSU - The ND Higher Challenge Grant has been extremely beneficial for Minot State University and our students. We have been able to add forty-nine new endowments during the 2019-21' biennium with thirty-nine endowments receiving challenge grant support. Repeatedly, donors are stepping forward to take advantage of the matching funds. The wonderful thing about these endowments is they will benefit students at Minot State University in perpetuity. There is not a better program to assist in limiting student debt. In addition, the MSU Development Foundation has achieved record breaking fundraising years. The Challenge Grant program has been instrumental in this fundraising success.

NDSCS - The ND Challenge Grant has allowed the NDSCS Foundation to increase and grow our current Scholarship program from awarding \$208,000 in 2013, to awarding over \$1.1 million in FY22. This has helped NDSCS retain and recruit a larger pool of students. We have also grown our department awards by over \$80,000 annually, because of the early Endowments that were set up for Programs. Those Endowments have been added too, and continue to be, an annual source of income for our programs.

The Challenge grant offers us a wonderful tool in encouraging our donors to leave a legacy and see what their gift can provide. We are so fortunate to have this opportunity and feel it needs to continue to be an avenue for our future fundraising efforts.

NDSU - Philanthropy is a powerful game-changer for those that benefit from its impact, and at North Dakota State University, it is our students that benefit the most. Since the inception of the North Dakota Challenge Grant Program, a large and growing pool of scholarship funds have been established to directly impact undergraduate and graduate students.

These resources directly assist students in their ability to obtain a degree from NDSU; for many, the lack of this kind of support would be a barrier to life transformation and making a difference in our society. Scholarships have been established to support students in every area of campus, including all academic programs, performing arts, entrepreneurship initiatives and leadership programs.

This program has also been extremely attractive to benefactors, willing to partner with the state of North Dakota and leverage a partnership for greater impact. We are hopeful for its continued funding and enhanced future impact for students, faculty, and programs at NDSU.


UND – Since its inception in 2013, the public-private partnership that the North Dakota Challenge Grant has created has impacted thousands of students at the University of North Dakota. We have focused our efforts on raising support that impacts strategic priorities of the university as well as college-based initiatives including scholarships, faculty, and academic programs. The University of North Dakota has utilized allocated dollars totaling almost \$19 million and raised \$37 million in private support to fund 204 endowments. The North Dakota Challenge Grant has helped raise support from across the nation for the University of North Dakota.

VCSU – The Challenge Grant continues to assist us in growing our endowment scholarship pool which in turn has assisted in our enrollment growth at VCSU. In addition, having the ability to match our donors' donations to their endowment funds has increased our fundraising and the donors have benefitted from the match to their scholarship.

WSC - As of June 30, 2022, the combined efforts of patrons endowing scholarships at WSC and the addition of Challenge Grant funding from the State Legislature has reached a total of over \$7.5 million. In the 2021-22 school year students received over \$2.6 million in direct scholarship support in the form of regional, non-regional, and housing scholarships, in large part due to the output from the Challenge Grant and other similar endowment and gift campaigns. Since Williston State College uses all matching funds from the Challenge Grant to support student scholarships, it is safe to say that, were it not for the Challenge Grant and other planned giving endowments, the Eastern half of Montana and the Western half of North Dakota would have students unable to afford or attend college. The regional scholarships, through the WSC Foundation and Challenge Grant funding continue to make WSC an affordable and academically challenging option when planning for college. With this funding, WSC is the most affordable college in the NDUS in terms of tuition charged to students.


Changes from October 31, 2021







