

PSYC 100 Human Relations in Organizations

PSYC 105 Relationships and Self-Esteem

PSYC 111 Introduction to Psychology

A survey of the scientific study of behavior and mental processes.

PSYC 210 Child Development

An introduction to the emotional, intellectual, physical, perceptual, and social development of the child from conception to adolescence. The relationship between development and parenting also will be explored.

PSYC 221 Current Psychological Issues

The study of the human behavior with a focus on issues that relate closely to life around us Prerequisite: PSYC 111.

PSYC 230 Educational Psychology

PSYC 240 Industrial/Organizational Psychology

An introduction to the application of the principles and methods of psychology to the workplace. Specific topics include employee selection, training, organizational behavior, leadership, conflict and cooperation, motivation, job satisfaction and morale, performance appraisal, and stress in the workplace.

PSYC 250 Developmental Psychology

A survey of the psychology of human life span development.

PSYC 252/352 Child Psychology

A survey of human development from conception through childhood.

PSYC 255 Child & Adolescent Psychology

Overview of theories of human psychological development from conception through adolescence.

PSYC 261 Psychology of Adjustment

Principles of the normal range of adjustment mechanism in behavior as it responds to life situations and changes.

Prerequisite: Psychology 111 or consent of instructor.

PSYC 270/370 Abnormal Psychology

A survey of the classification, symptoms, and etiology of psychological disorders.

PSYC 280/380 Introduction to Health Psychology

Health is not just about physical ailments and taking medicine. One's thoughts, emotions and behaviors are all influential factors in health. This course examines how biological, psychological, and social factors interact with and affect health. Students will gain an understanding of the important role that psychology plays within the health care system. Everyone has experienced some kind of health issue. I encourage you to relate your own experiences to the topics we discuss in class. This course will consist of lecture, discussion, and group work.

PSYC 353 Adolescent Psychology

A study of human development during adolescence. Special attention given to young adolescent needs and implications for educational practice in the middle grades. Prerequisite: PSYC 111.
