NOTES

To improve student access and success in North Dakota University System institutions, the State Board of Higher Education has implemented enrollment policies that better reflect the differentiated missions of research universities, regional universities, and community colleges. This report addresses the transition in policy by grouping data by institutional mission.

The North Dakota University System includes:

Two research universities:

- North Dakota State University (NDSU) and
- University of North Dakota (UND).

Four regional universities:

- Dickinson State University (DSU)
- Mayville State University (MaSU)
- Minot State University (MiSU)
- Valley City State University (VCSU)

Five two-year community colleges:

- Bismarck State College (BSC)
- Dakota College of Bottineau (DCB)
- Lake Region State College (LRSC)
- North Dakota State College of Science (NDSCS)
- Williston State College (WSC)

As amended January 19, 2012, State Board of Higher Education Policy 440 states as follows,

“Each campus shall report fall and spring semester enrollments for degree credit students based on the number of students enrolled on the twentieth scheduled class day of the fall and spring semesters. "Enrolled" means: the student has registered and paid tuition and fees, made arrangements to pay or a plan for payment is in place; an extension has been granted as provided by Policy 830.1; or, the institution has other documentation the student is registered and in attendance, including, for example, documented class attendance or student access or use of a learning management system or other online services on or after the first scheduled class day of the semester.”

As required by the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education, this enrollment report includes all degree credit enrollments for all NDUS institutions and is consistent with protocols implemented by the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System. Data for institutions of higher education not organized under the NDUS is reported herein as available.

Readers of previous fall enrollment reports may notice numerous improvements in formatting, including revisions in footnoting, definitions, and report organization. Each table now includes a specific reference of source data used to prepare that table, which was a frequently asked question in the past.

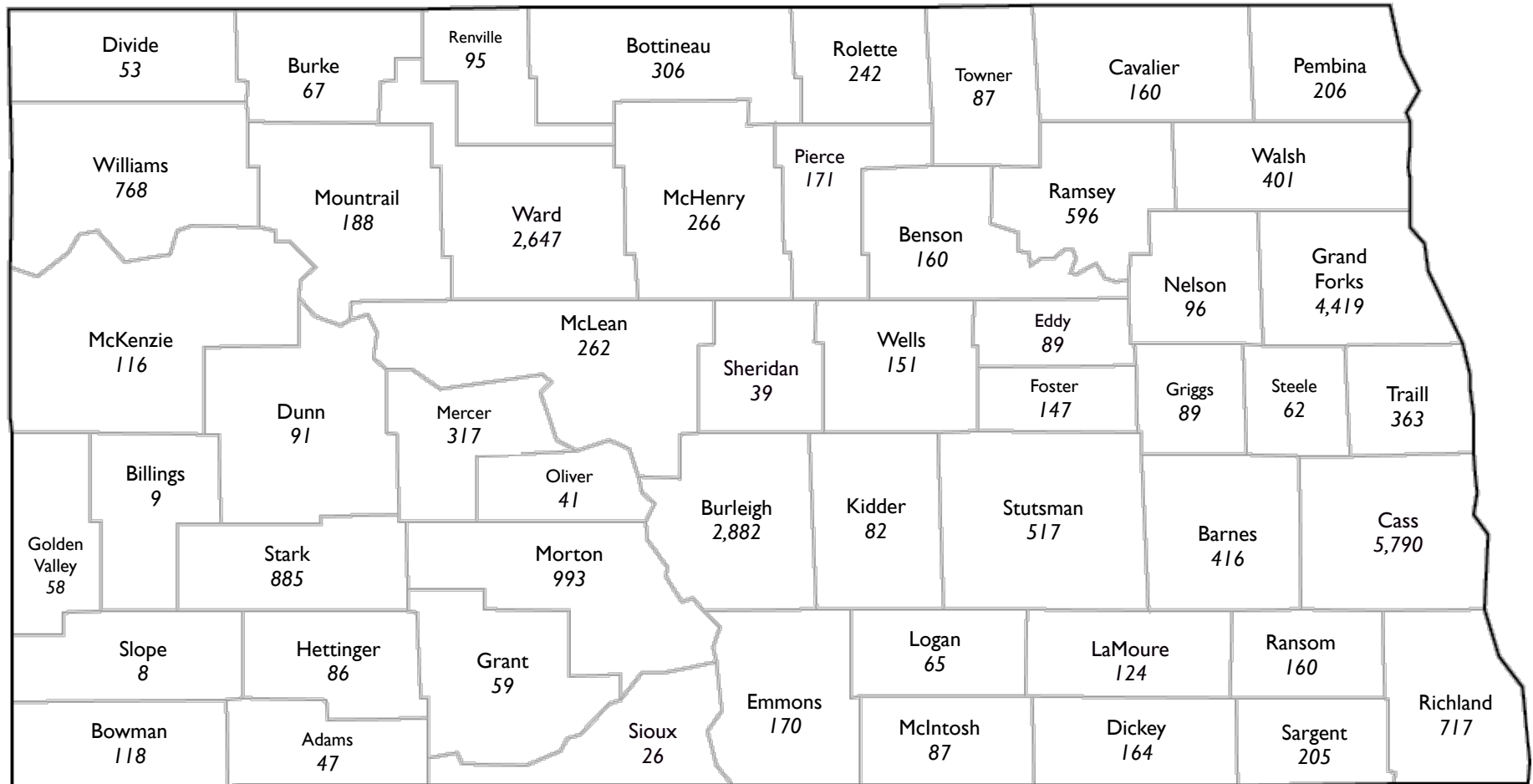

Glossary

Age – Student age as of the 20th day of classes during the specified term.

APO Ae/AP – A military post office address.

American Indian or Alaska Native – An IPEDS definition that identifies original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) who maintain cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Asian – An IPEDS definition that identifies people having origin in the Far East, Southeast, Southeast Asia, or the Indian Subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippines Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

A-synch (asynchronous) – Classes in which instructors provide materials, lectures, tests, and assignments that students can access and complete anytime during a given time frame.

Audio One-way – An audio communication from the instructor to the student where the student cannot provide an audio response (e.g. radio, audiotape).

Audio Two-way – A conference, most frequently used over the telephone between two or more remote locations with live, audio transmission.

Beginning Freshman – A full-time or part-time student attending any institution for the first time as a freshman. Because part-time students are included, this number is not the same as the IPEDS first-time full-time count.

Black or African American – An IPEDS definition that identifies a person as having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

BSC – Bismarck State College, a community college, offers one four-year Bachelor's of Applied Science program achieved by completing two years of coursework beyond a two-year associate in an applied science degree. The enrollments of this program are shown for students as juniors/seniors.

Census Data – Each campus shall report fall and spring semester enrollments for degree credit students based on the number of students enrolled on the twentieth scheduled class day of the fall and spring semesters.

CD ROM – Communications using a compact disc with read-only-memory.

Collaborative Developmental Only – A student who enrolls in a course at an NDUS institution other than his/her home institution for the purpose of completing developmental courses only. These students are non-degree seeking students at the institution at which they are taking collaborative developmental courses. Students in this category are not included in the official headcount because of their non-degree status.

Collaborative Enrolled in Degree Credit – Student who enrolls in a degree credit course at an NDUS institution other than his/her home institution.

Collaborative Student – A student who enrolls in a course at an NDUS institution other than his/her home institution.

Combo – A combination of any of the delivery methods with no one method providing 50 percent or more of instruction.

Correspondence – An independent study course in which all communications between the instructor and student is accomplished through the mail, fax, and/or email. Instruction is given by means of a course syllabus, textbooks, video and audio-cassette, and additional reference and instructional materials.

County of Origin – The county of residence at the time of admission.

Credit Hour – The unit by which an institution measures its course work for application towards a degree. Historically, each credit hour involves 15 or 16 fifty-minute periods of instruction per semester, or the equivalent.

DE & On-campus– Student has enrollments in both DE (distance education) and on-campus during the same semester.

Degree Credit – Instructional activities associated with the amount of instructor/student contact time that could be applied toward a college degree or developmental/remedial courses taken by a degree-seeking student as reported to IPEDS.

Developmental – Basic academic skills courses designed to prepare students to complete postsecondary academic degree-credit courses.

Developmental Courses – Developmental courses are basic academic skills courses designed to prepare students to complete regular academic degree-credit courses. Effective with the Fall 2010 term, all NDUS courses numbered less than 100 and English 100 and Math 101 and 102 are developmental courses. Developmental courses may count toward a student's full-time course load. Math 102 may be used to meet degree credit requirements in certificate, diploma and A.A.S. programs.

Dual Credit Student – A high school student who enrolls in college classes and also earns high school credit.

Duplicated – An enrollment count in which an individual student may be counted more than once because they are enrolled in more than one medium (face-to-face, online) or more than one campus.

E-learning – Courses delivered through a technological medium. This category includes audio, video, CD ROM, and Internet delivery of courses and excludes correspondence and face-to-face off campus.

Enrolled Students – SBHE Policy 440 defines enrolled students as students who are registered for classes as of the 20th day of the term. SBHE Policy 830.1 requires all registered students to have paid tuition and fees or made arrangements to pay no later than the 12th day of the term.

Enrollment in Developmental and Degree Credit – Students who are enrolled in both developmental and degree credit courses during the same term.

Early Entry Student – A student who is enrolled as a college student while also enrolled in high school.

First-time Freshman – A student attending any institution full-time for the first time at the undergraduate level. Includes students enrolled in academic or occupational programs. Also includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior summer term, and students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned before graduation from high school). This is a specific group (or cohort) established for tracking purposes and reported to IPEDS.

Face-to-face – This term is used to describe the traditional classroom environment where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place.

Face-to-face Off Campus – A classroom environment where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place in an off-campus location.

Face-to-face On Campus – A classroom environment where the instructor and students are physically located in the same place.

FTE (Full-time equivalent) – Student credit hours accumulated at the undergraduate level divided by 15 plus student credit hours accumulated at the graduate level divided by 12. Every professional student is counted as one FTE student.

Full-time (FT) – Students enrolled in 12 or more credit hours as of the 20th day of classes.

Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment of Part-time Students – The student credit hours accumulated at the undergraduate level divided by 15 plus the student credit hours accumulated at the graduate level divided by 12. Every professional student is counted as one FTE student.

Graduate Student – A student who holds a bachelor's or first professional degree, or equivalent, and is enrolled in a graduate degree program.

HC (headcount) – SBHE Policy 440 defines enrolled students as “students who are registered for classes as of the 20th day of the term.”

Headcount Campus Enrollment – Number of students enrolled at the institution following the 20th day of classes of the term. Each student equals one headcount, regardless of credit hours taken.

Headcount Enrollment – A student counted as one enrollment in degree credit courses at his/her home campus as of the 20th scheduled class day.

Headcount System Enrollment – Number of students enrolled in the NDUS, who are enrolled at more than one campus, following the 20th day of classes in the term.

High School Student Enrolled in College Coursework (formerly dual credit) - Qualified high school students enrolled in college degree credit courses.

Home Address – Official home address as reported by the student. If no address is reported by the student, the parents' address is used. The local campus address is used in the event there is no parental address.

Interactive Video Network (IVN) – A video conferencing network that provides two-way audio and two-way video allowing the teacher and students to be in different locations yet see and hear each other.

Internet – Online courses, discussions, or other communications occurring in an electronic format.

Internet Asynchronous – Online interaction occurring independent of time or location, e.g. email.

Internet-based – Instruction in an electronic format via the Internet.

Internet Synchronous – Online interaction occurring independent of location, but at the same time (real time), e.g. Internet chat.

IPEDS (Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System) **Race/Ethnicity** (new definitions) – Categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) that are used to describe groups to which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other eligible non-citizens.

Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC) – A non-profit regional organization, established by compact statute, to assist Midwestern states in advancing higher education through interstate cooperation and resource sharing. Member states include: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander – An IPEDS definition that identifies a person as having origins with any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

Non-degree Credit – Student enrolled earning credit in which the credit does not count toward a degree.

Non Resident – A student whose domicile is outside North Dakota.

Non Resident Alien – a citizen or national of the U.S. and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Note: Non-resident aliens are to be reported separately in the places provided, rather than in any of the racial/ethnic categories described by IPEDS.

Non-vet – Men and women who have never served on active duty in the U.S. military services. Members of the National Guard or Reserves are classified as “non-veterans” unless they were ordered to active duty for reasons other than training or yearly summer camp.

No Response – An IPEDS definition that identifies student who did not identify with a selected race.

On Campus Presence – Students who are enrolled in at least one traditional face-to-face course at the main campus.

One-way Video – Video connection only allows for the faculty member to be seen and heard by the students.

Part-time – Students enrolled in less than 12 credit hours as of the 20th day of classes.

Pre-recorded Video or Audio – A video or audio communications that has been prerecorded on videotape or cassette. Recordings often complement other teaching methods, and content may be ongoing class sessions or specially produced for independent study.

Professional – A student who has completed a baccalaureate degree and is enrolled in a post-baccalaureate program leading to a professional degree in law, medicine, or pharmacy. IPEDS and the SBHE Policy recognize pharmacy as a first professional program. ConnectND is being adjusted to report pharmacy students as professional students.

Race – Group or groups with which a person identifies or having origins as identified as valid values for IPEDS reporting.

Resident – A resident student, for the purposes of this report, is a student having legal domicile in North Dakota.

Special / Unclassified – A student enrolled in undergraduate or post-baccalaureate level credit classes with other students without declaring an intention to earn a degree, diploma, or certificate. This category also includes students who cannot be classified by academic level. High school students enrolled in college classes are considered special/unclassified students.

Student – For the purpose of the fall enrollment report, a student is a person enrolled in degree credit courses, regardless of the time of day or workload of the student.

Synch (synchronous) – Online classes that require students and instructors to be present online at the same time.

Transfer Student – A student entering the reporting institution for the first time but known to have previously attended a postsecondary institution at the same level. The student may transfer with or without credit.

Tri-college Student – A student enrolled at Moorhead State University or Concordia College and who is registered for one or more courses at NDSU.

Tuition Residency Status – A classification assigned to each student at the time of enrollment for tuition purposes.

TV Broadcast – Communication using the capabilities of educational television broadcasting over established cable networks or otherwise. Programs can be viewed live or prerecorded for a later pre-determined time for viewing.

TV Live – Faculty and students are in different locations at the same time. The faculty member conducting the class is visible to the student via live television.

TV Prerecorded – Archived TV live programs that are made accessible to students for various reasons.

Two-way Video – Simultaneous video and audio communication between remote sites that may include televised lecture, two-way discussion, and use of presentation software.

Undergraduate Student – A student who is enrolled in a postsecondary program leading to a certificate, diploma, associate, or bachelors level degree.

Unduplicated – Students taking courses at more than one campus or through more than one instructional medium in the same semester are counted once.

Unknown – An IPEDS category used to report students or employees whose race and ethnicity are not known.

Veteran – Men and women who have previously served on active duty in the U.S. military services. The veteran category may include military members of the National Guard and Reserve units who have been called to active duty for reasons related to national defense.

Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE) – A regional organization created by the Western Regional Education Compact and adopted in the 1950s by Western states (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, South Dakota, Washington, and Wyoming) to facilitate resource sharing among state systems of higher education.

White – An IPEDS definition that identifies the race of persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
