The AG opinion letter clarified that the state match may indirectly benefit students who are also athletes, so long as the basis for the scholarship is academic, rather than athletic.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

PERMANENT ENDOWMENT AGREEMENT

The Bismarck State College Foundation is duly incorporated as a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of North Dakota to be operated exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, including, but not limited to, the managing of endowment assets for the benefit of Bismarck State College, and is authorized to receive gifts and bequests, and to make contracts of investment, sales and disposition.

This permanent endowment agreement is between (Donor) and the Bismarck State College Foundation (Foundation), 1255 Schafer Street, PO Box 5587, Bismarck, North Dakota (tax ID).

The name of this endowment shall be the Scholarship Endowment Fund. This endowment is established with a direct gift from the Donor to the Foundation. The direct gift hereby made is declared to be irrevocable for the purpose of establishing an endowment. The Donor or any other persons may, at any time, either with a direct or deferred gift arrangement, make additional contributions to the Foundation to be added to the Scholarship Endowment Fund. The assets of this endowment shall be held in perpetuity by the Foundation.

Distribution will commence when the fund reaches \$20,000 in contributions/earnings. A distribution from this fund shall be made for the purpose of supporting scholarships per the established guidelines.

Distributions will be made at the discretion of the Foundation Board of Trustees and shall be for purposes identified in this Agreement. Such purposes shall fall within the funding purposes identified in the Bylaws of the Foundation. If the purposes identified in this Agreement no longer exist, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall first work with the Donor to establish a new purpose. If the Donor is not living or capable of making a change of purpose, the Foundation Board of Trustees shall endeavor to distribute funds at the annual distribution rate for a purpose that is as close as possible to the original purpose of the endowment.

No part of the corpus or net income of this endowment shall be diverted from exclusively educational purposes. It is specifically agreed that any endowment losses must be applied against the value of this endowment and not against the net unrestricted assets of the Foundation. It is the intention of this Agreement that the gifted funds shall be managed as an endowment fund subject to the North Dakota Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act and/or any amendments. The Foundation hereby agrees to faithfully administer this endowment in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of North Dakota.

We pledge to the Bismarck State College Foundation a gift of \$20,000 over 4 years. Funds received by the BSC Foundation will be designated to the holarship Endowment Fund.



Project: Educational Infrastructure

Community Support: From the start, community support has been a hallmark of LRSC's existence. The Devils Lake Public School District partnered with the community to launch the college in 1941, and ever since, the community has fiercely defended and generously supported the college's mission and needs.

Historically, community members have supported scholarships. The North Dakota Higher Education Challenge Grant sparked interest in providing support for new classroom technologies, instructional tools, and digital resources which will improve LRSC's educational infrastructure. The Community College Foundation set a goal to secure support for each of the college's academic and technical programs. These new resources will support faculty work to provide exemplary learning opportunities and provide access to tools and resources that are beyond the reach of the college's regular budget. In consideration of a gift of \$50,000 from Estate of LeRoy A Anderson, North Dakota State College of Science Alumni Foundation hereby establishes a permanent endowment fund to be known as the LeRoy A Anderson Endowment.

The endowment will be administered by the NDSCS Alumni Foundation as follows:

- One or more award(s) can be given annually by the NDSCS Financial Aid Office, NDSCS Award Committee and/or Program/Department Chair.
- 2. Endowment criteria may include, but not be limited to:
 - Full-time or Part-time student
 - First-year or Second-year student
 - Forolled in the Land Surveying & Civil Engineering Technology
 - Must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or above
- 3. The endowment will first be awarded in the academic year FY22 (2021-2022).
- The endowment will be held and administered by the NDSCS Alumni Foundation as a part of its endowed funds.
- 5. The endowment will be subject to general guidelines and policies adapted by the NDSCS Foundation Board for the management of the endowed funds, including combining it with other Foundation assets for investment purposes. These guidelines are reviewed frequently to determine the investment, allocation of the return and distribution strategies. The policies also pertain to the allocation of income, loss, fees and expenses associated with the endowed funds, as well as securing the administration of the funds.
- 6. The established endowment shall be held in perpetuity and no part of the principal sum may be withdrawn.
- 7. The NDSCS Alumni Foundation reserves the right to review the endowment criteria as needed. If future conditions/events make it impossible for the NDSCS Alumni Foundation to comply with the terms and condition of the endowment agreement and no donors or heirs are available, the endowment may be redirected in a manner which most closely carries out the original intent of the donor.



One Life Immediate Payment Annuity for Annuitant Roger Hentges by Donor Roger Hentges

This Agreement is made July 15, 2020, between Roger Hentges, 707 Northridge Way, West Fargo, Minnesota 58078 (hereafter the "Donor") and a charitable organization, known as North Dakota State College of Science Foundation, 800 6th St N, Wahpeton, North Dakota 58076 (hereafter the "Charitable Organization").

- 1. <u>Property Transfer</u>. The Donor, as evidence of a desire to support the work of the Charitable Organization and to make a charitable gift, has this day contributed to the Charitable Organization \$25,000.00, which is more fully described in the attached Schedule A.

The Reasonably Commensurate Value of the annuity as of the date of this agreement for a male age 78 is \$24,884.25. The interest of the annuitant or annuitants in the gift annuity may not be assigned to the qualified charity sooner than the earlier of: (i) the date of death of the annuitant or annuitants; or (ii) five years after the date of the contribution.

In addition, to the extent an amendment does not conflict with federal law, the Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties solely for the purpose of compliance with state law, with such amendment subject to approval of the Insurance Commissioner of the State of North Dakota.



Dear Mr. Mayo:

On behalf of The Leona M. & Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust (the "Trust"), we are pleased to inform you that a grant of \$750,000 has been awarded to North Dakota State University Development Foundation ("Grantee") to be payable in installments as set forth below (the "Grant"). The Grant must be used solely for the purposes described in Grantee's grant proposal dated December 3, 2014 (the "Proposal"), specially to endow an annual scholarship program for students to the North Dakota State University's Master's in Public Health program for students specializing in American Indian public health. This letter, together with the Proposal attached hereto as Attachment A and the final approved budget dated December 22, 2014 attached hereto as Attachment B (the "Final Budget"), constitute the agreement between the Grantee and the Trust with respect to the Grant (the "Agreement").

1. Grant Period

The Grant is for a period beginning December 30, 2014 and ending December 29, 2015 (the "Grant Period").

2. Grant Payments

Grantee will receive full grant payment of \$750,000 within two months of the Trust's receipt of this signed Agreement.

3. Grant Management: Use of Grant Funds

Grantee agrees:

(a) To use the Grant solely to support the specific activities described in the Proposal. Grantee must provide the Trust with timely written notice of any meterial changes proposed to be made in the scope or purpose of the Grant. All such proposed changes to the supported activities must be approved by the Trust prior to implementation.

- (b) To use Grant funds only for allowable costs as detailed in the Final Budget attached hereto as Attachment B or otherwise approved by the Trust, and to maintain standard accounting records of all expenditures.
- (c) To submit to the Trust a written request and justification for any budget modification that involves any reallocation of spending with respect to any budget line item. Approval of such a request is at the sole discretion of the Trust and must be received prior to implementation. All approved modifications will be reflected in a revised Final Budget which shall be attached hereto as Attachment B and shall replace the previously approved Final Budget.
- (d) To maintain a separate accounting of the Grant funds.
- (e) Not to assign this Grant, or subcontract the services funded by this Grant, except as currently specified in the Proposal, without the express prior written consent of the Trust.
- (f) Not to use any portion of this Grant for the purpose of (i) carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(1) of the United States Internal Revenue Code (the "Code")); (ii) influencing the outcome of any specific public election, or carrying on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive (within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(2) of the Code); (iii) making a "taxable expenditure" described in Section 4945(d)(3) of the Code or (iv) making a grant to any individual for travel, study or other similar purposes, or to any organization.
- (g) To repay to the Trust any Grant funds not used for the purposes set forth in the Proposal or otherwise approved by the Trust, and to repay to the Trust any Grant funds unexpended by the end of the Grant Period, such repayment to occur within thirty (30) days of the end of the Grant Period.
- (h) If Grantee wishes to use the unexpended funds remaining at the end of the Grant Period to continue work on the program, Grantee may request, no less than four weeks before the expiration of the Grant Period, a no-cost extension of the Grant Period to expend remaining funds to complete the purposes of the Grant. Approval of such a request is at the sole discretion of the Trust.

4. Selection of Scholarship Recipients

This grant is to endow a scholarship at the North Dakota State University's Master's in Public Health program aimed at reducing financial barriers for participation in a course of study that will permit graduates to contribute significantly to improve public health systems serving American Indian populations, Criteria for selection of recipients shall be;

(a) Enrollment in North Dakota State University at time of application.

- (b) A two year commitment to American Indian-serving health program following graduation.
- (c) There shall be a preference towards students pursuing the Master's in Public Health American Indian Health track, of American Indian descent, and those demonstrating a financial need.

5. Confidentiality

- (a) Grantee agrees to protect the confidentiality of any confidential and proprietary information of the Trust and of others, that Grantee receives in connection with this Grant, in the same manner that Grantee protects its own confidential and proprietary information, and in any case, with no less than reasonable care, and not to use such information for any purpose other than to further the purposes of the Grant.
- (b) The Trust agrees to protect the confidentiality of Grantee's confidential and proprietary information in the same manner as its protects its own confidential and proprietary information, and in any case, with no less than reasonable care, and not to use such information for any purpose other than to further the purposes of the Grant.
- (c) The obligation of either party to protect any such confidential and proprietary information will not attach to any information that is, at the time of disclosure or thereafter becomes known in the public domain through no action of such party; is independently developed by the recipient without reference to or use of the disclosed information; or that is provided in good faith by a third party owing no obligation of confidentiality regarding such information and on a non-confidential basis.

6. Compliance with Laws

Grantee agrees:

- (a) To ensure that all potential recipients and participants of Grantee's programs and services have access to programs and receive equitable services without regard to race, sex, education, ethnicity, socio-economic status, religion, ability/disability, sexual orientation, gender selfidentification, age, country of origin, first language, marital status, or citizenship.
- (b) To conduct all programs and activities funded by this Grant in full compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and ordinances including, without limitation, all laws and regulations relating to the privacy and confidentiality of patient health information including, without limitation, the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and the Standards of Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information 45 C.F.R. parts 160 and 164 (the "HIPAA Privacy Regulations").

- (c) Not to use any portion of the Grant to engage in, support or promote violence, terrorist activity or related training of any kind. Grantee agrees to include this provision in all subcontracts/subawards issued under this Grant Agreement.
- (d) Not to use any funds received from Grantor to proselytize directly or indirectly on behalf of any religious faith, doctrine or belief, or permit any such funds to be used in any manner that directly or indirectly advocates or espouses any religious faith, doctrine or belief.

7. Reporting

Grantee agrees:

- (a) To submit interim grant reports, if applicable, in accordance with the Trust's specifications and include a financial report of cumulative expenses incurred through the end of the reporting period, in accordance with the schedule in (c) below. Such reports must demonstrate to the reasonable satisfaction of the Trust that all amounts granted by the Trust in the installment covered by the report were used for the purposes for which such funds were granted and that Grantee has made satisfactory progress with respect to the Grant.
- (b) To submit a final grant report no later than thirty (30) days after the end of the Grant Period which should be to the Trust's specifications and include a financial report of expenses incurred during the entire Grant Period. The final report should review the activities supported by the Grant and the successes and difficulties in achieving the purposes for which the funds were granted.
- (c) All reports are due on or before the following date(s):

(d) To respond to and comply with the Trust's requests for updated budgets, additional reports and/or other information about the Grant at any time during the Grant term.

8. Inspection of Records

Grantee agrees:

(a) To keep a record of all expenditures relating to the Grant, with appropriate supporting documentation for at least four years following the year in which the Grant funds are fully expended or the termination of the Grant for any other reason. (b) To allow the Trust at its discretion, or an independent third-party evaluator selected by the Trust, to examine all expenditures under this Grant in accordance with standard auditing practice. The Trust will provide advance notice of any audit, to help ensure that any audit is conducted at a mutually agreeable time so as not to disrupt Grantee's operations.

Acknowledgment, Publicity, Publications, and Communications with the Media

- (a) The text of all press releases, public announcements, statements, campaign reports or materials to be issued by Grantee, that mention the Grant or the Trust or use the Trust's name or logo, are subject to advance written approval by the Trust and must be coordinated with the Trust's designated Program Director and its Director of Communications and Public Affairs. Grantee shall provide the Trust with copies of any and all final press releases, public announcements, and/or publications related to the Grant. Grantee will have the right under this paragraph to list the grant in a publicly accessible database or related publications/reports which states the name of the Trust, the value of the grant, the Investigator, the title, and the period of performance.
- (b) Grantee shall inform the Trust about, and refer to the Trust as appropriate, any media inquiries about the Trust or the Grant. Neither the Grantee nor its representatives shall speak on behalf of the Trust without the Trust's prior explicit instructions or approvals.
- (e) Grantee shall provide the Trust with the option, in the Trust's sole discretion, to have any buildings, programs, chairs or fellowships created by the Grant officially named after The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust. The Grantee agrees that such name shall be the sole name of the building, program, fellowship or chair in perpetuity. No other names shall appear in written materials or electronic media issued by the Grantee or the Trust with respect to such buildings, programs, chairs or fellowships.
- (d) The Trust reserves the right, at any time and without providing any reason or explanation, to request, in writing, that the Trust's name no longer be associated with a building, program, fellowship or chair funded by this Grant. The Grantee agrees that, within thirty (30) days of receiving such written request, the Grantee will remove or cause the removal of all references to the Trust associated with such building, program, fellowship or chair.

10. Indemnification and Insurance

(a) Grantee hereby agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Trust, its Trustees, officers, employees and agents, from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), directly or indirectly, wholly or partially arising from or in connection with any act or omission of Grantee its employees or agents, in obtaining or accepting the Grant from the Trust, in expending or applying the proceeds of the Grant from the Trust, or in carrying out the project or program to be funded or financed with Grant funds from the Trust, except to the extent that such claims, liabilities, losses or expenses arise from or in connection with the gross negligence of the Trust, its Trustees, employees or agents. Grantee agrees to include a similar indemnification provision in all subgrants or subcontracts that are related to or in fulfillment of the purposes of the Grant.

(b) Grantee agrees to implement and maintain throughout the Grant Period insurance in types and amounts that are reasonable and appropriate for the activities being funded by the Grant.

11. Tax-Exempt Status and Good Standing of Grantee

- (a) Grantee represents and warrants, (a) that it is an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and is classified as a public charity either (i) within the meaning of either Section 509(a)(1) or Section 509(a)(2) of the Code or (ii) within the meaning of Section 509(a)(3) of the Code, provided that Grantee has established to the satisfaction of the Trust that Grantee is a Type I, Type II or functionally integrated Type III supporting organization and (b) there is no issue presently pending before any office of the Internal Revenue Service that could result in any change to Grantee's status under said Sections of the Code. The Grantee shall have provided to the Trust a copy of its Determination Letter from the Internal Revenue Service evidencing its tax classification. The Grantee agrees to notify the Trust immediately in writing of any changes to its status as a public charity under Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a) of the Code. Any such change shall constitute cause for termination by the Trust in accordance with Section 11 below.
- (b) Grantee represents and warrants that Grantee is a not-for-profit corporation duly incorporated, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the jurisdiction in which Grantee is incorporated.

12. Termination

If the Trust terminates this Agreement for cause, Grantee shall immediately repay the full amount of Grant funds that are unspent as of the date of the termination. In addition to the circumstances cited above, the Trust shall have cause to terminate the Agreement if the purpose of the Grant has been fully completed; the Grantee becomes unable to carry out the purposes of the Grant; the Grantee uses the Grant funds for a purpose other than those set forth in this Agreement, unless the Trust has consented in writing to such modification; or the Grantee is in breach of any term of the Agreement. The Trust reserves the right to request immediate reimbursement of any Grant funds used

for purposes other than those for which the Grant was made or to which the Trust has consented.

13. Other Terms and Conditions

- (a) The Trust hereby reserves the right to enforce the terms of this Agreement through arbitration. Such arbitration shall be in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association then in force and effect. In such case, the award rendered by the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties hereto and no dispute under the Agreement will be the subject of any court action or litigation in the court system except disputes relating to injunctions or other equitable relief.
- (b) The Grantee may not assign or otherwise transfer any of its rights or delegate any of its obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the Trust.
- (c) This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Trust and Grantee with respect to the Grant and supersedes any prior oral or written understandings or agreements. This Agreement will be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without regard to New York's choice of law provisions. This Agreement may be modified only by a written instrument duly executed by both the Grantee and the Trust.
- (d) The provisions of Sections 4, 8 and 9 shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement indefinitely.
- (e) The Grantee represents and warrants that it has full power and authority to execute and deliver this Agreement, and its representative signing below has full power and authority to execute this Agreement on its behalf and bind it to all the terms and conditions.

I. Proposal Summary

Executive Summary

The goal of public health is to prevent disease and to promote health. The American Indian (AI) population in the Northern Plains suffers from among the worst health disparities in the nation. Death rates from preventable causes, including diabetes, cancer, heart disease, and other preventable conditions are much higher than in the general populations of ND, SD, NE, MT, WY, IA, and MN. The purpose of the Endowed Scholarship in American Indian Public Health at North Dakota State University is to address these disparities through education and public health workforce development. Historically, there has been a shortage of public health professionals working with tribal populations. NDSU is the ideal location for the Endowed Scholarship because it is home to the only AI-focused Master of Public Health (MPII) Program in the nation. The Director, Donald Warne, MD, MPH, is a member of the Oglala Lakota tribe from SD, and he is the only AI MPH Director in the nation. The Endowed Scholarship will be unique nationally, and it will build upon previous work, including Public Health Education programming of the Heimsley-funded American Indian Public Health Resource Center.

Benefit to the Community:

The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust seeks to Improve rural healthcare, and the Trust's Education Program aspires to advance American economic competitiveness as well as Individual social mobility. The proposed Scholarship is consistent with these goals. While many Americans have difficulty accessing affordable health services, the obstacles faced by providers and patients in rural areas differ from those in urban areas. Due to lower average incomes, geographic isolation, and a severe shortage of qualified health professionals, rural Americans are often disadvantaged in their ability to access quality health services. These circumstances are even worse for rural AI populations, with higher rates of poverty and even less access to public health services, health care, and health promotion programs.

Who Will Benefit:

The Endowed Scholarship will benefit the broader AI community through increased access to well-trained public health professionals, and individual scholarship recipients will benefit directly in terms of their own education, development, income, and social mobility. In addition, all members of society will benefit through improved health status, decreased burden on the health care

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system, and improved rural health equity.

Expected Outcomes:

The NDSU MPH Program is a national leader in engaging and empowering tribal members to pursue higher education in public health. A challenge faced by many potential students is the financial burden of graduate-level tuition. The Endowed Scholarship will create 2 two-year scholarships annually (four total per year, two each for first-year and second-year students). The potential to improve health systems, access to services, and health outcomes based on education and workforce development is significant. Outcomes will include annual graduation of two Helmsley-funded, Endowed Scholarship Master of Public Health professionals who will work in tribal and rural populations. As an endowed program, the scholarship will be available in perpetuity, and the long-term result will be dozens of well-trained public health professionals working in populations of need.

NDSU's Mission: With energy and momentum, North Dakota State University addresses the needs and aspirations of people in a changing world by building on our land-grant foundation.

North Dakota State University is distinctive as a student-focused, land-grant, research university, ranked by the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education among the top 108 public and private universities in the country. NDSU is in the elite category of "Research Universities/Very High Research Activity," with several programs ranked in the Top 100 by the National Science Foundation. NDSU is fully accredited as an institution by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The North Dakota Agricultural College, was founded in 1890 as a land-grant university. In 1960, the name was officially changed to North Dakota State University. NDSU's current enrollment is over 13,000 students, with over 650 resident faculty members. NDSU offers over 100 undergraduate and approximately 100 graduate programs of study, with degrees awarded at the doctoral, master's, professional, and baccalaureate levels. Various undergraduate minors and certificate programs are also available. NDSU's research expenditures surpass \$100 million annually. NDSU's main campus encompasses 104 buildings on nearly forty-one square blocks or 258 total acres, 5.8 miles of streets and 16.7 miles of sidewalks and has continued its expansion into downtown Fargo. In all, NDSU is located on 22,053 acres of North Dakota land.

The key problems to be addressed include the significant public health and educational disparities

among American Indians (AIs) in the Northern Plains. Considerable health disparities exist between the AI and the general U.S. populations. The economic, social, and physical conditions in communities have a major influence on health outcomes. The roots of health disparities for AI people are multi-faceted--low incomes, inadequate housing, substandard educational systems with low educational attainment, under-funded reservation schools, and poor nutrition, among others. The Endowed Scholarship will expand the number of weil-trained public health professionals working to improve health status.

Preventable diseases impact AI populations at a far greater rate than they do the rest of Americans. According to Indian Health Service data, death rates from preventable diseases among AIs are significantly greater than among non-Indians, including: Type 2 Diabetes 208% greater; Alcoholism 526% greater; Accidents/Unintentional Injuries 150% greater; and Suicide 60% greater. According to the North Dakota Department of Health, AIs have about double the prevalence of diabetes as compared to the white population. However, AIs have nearly six-fold the mortality rate from diabetes. Improved public health services and prevention programs are needed to eliminate these disparities. Graduates from the NDSU MPH Program will be well-positioned to address these disparities, and scholarship recipients will benefit directly in terms of their own educational attainment and professional opportunities.

Population Served

The initial population to be served by the Endowed Scholarship is consistent with the priority area of the Trust Rural Health Program, and includes the 23 tribes in the three-state region of ND, SD, and MN. Over 200,000 AIs live in this area. NDSU is centrally located in this three-state region in Fargo, ND. The NDSU MPH Program has existing partnerships in various capacities with nearly all 23 tribes in the region as well as with key community-based organizations, including the Great Plains Tribal Chairmen's Health Board and the Tri-State Area Health Education Center.

Contribution to Overall Educational Mission

The Endowed Scholarship in American Indian Public Health will be housed in the Master of Public Health Program within the College of Pharmacy, Nursing, and Allied Sciences at NDSU.

North Dakota State University

NDSU is committed to advancing knowledge and to improving the lives of people in ND, in the Northern Plains region, and globally. The College of Pharmacy, Nursing, and Allied Sciences (PNAS) at NDSU has over 1800 students

enrolled in the college's pre-professional, professional and graduate programs. Through its mission, the NDSU College of PNAS advances health care through research and scholarship and prepares students to become competent, caring, ethical professionals and citizens committed to lifelong learning. Through its people and programs PNAS places an emphasis and value on people, quality, professionalism and ethics, knowledge, teaching and learning, research and scholarship, and interdisciplinary education.

Master of Public Health Program

Public health is defined as the practice of helping members of society live healthler, longer lives. Public health is practiced by multidisciplinary teams of professionals whose training spans a wide array of medical, social, and physical sciences, making PNAS a logical home for the NDSU MPH Program. Public health focuses on the general health of communities through efforts to monitor the spread of diseases, initiatives to prevent disease and disability, and by promoting healthy lifestyles through education and community engagement.

The MPH program offers diverse tracks in public health that build upon the multidisciplinary strengths and skills of faculty and staff. The program focuses on rural public health, health promotion and disease prevention, disease state management, and related activities of interest to ND public health practitioners and policy makers. Specializations at NDSU include American Indian Public Health, Public Health in Clinical Systems, Health Promotion, and Management of Infectious Diseases.

American Indian Public Health Track

NDSU has created the only MPH Program in the nation that offers a curriculum specifically designed to prepare graduates to work in AI populations. Students take the required Core MPH coursework in addition to the MPH Practicum and the Master's paper—each focused on AI Public Health. Specialization courses include:

American Indian Health Policy
American Indian Health Disparities
Cultural Competence in American Indian Health
Research Issues in Tribal Communities
Case Studies in American Indian Health

The proposed Endowed Scholarship is aligned with the institutional vision and will be affiliated with the AI Public Health Track of the MPH Program, and it will leverage skillsets already in place to significantly improve public health resources and health outcomes for the AI population. The scholarship will increase the numbers of qualified applicants to the MPH Program by reducing potential financial limitations of the applicants. Based on its tremendous organizational capacities, skillsets, land-grant focus, and unique public health programs focused on the AI population, NDSU is the logical home for the Endowed Scholarship in American Indian Public Health.

Purpose of the Grant

The purpose of the grant is to establish the Endowed Scholarship in American Indian Public Health at North Dakota State University (NDSU).

Population Served

The Initial population to be served by the Endowed Scholarship is consistent with the priority area of the Trust Rural Health Program, and includes the 23 tribes in the three-state region of North Dakota, South Dakota, and Minnesota. Over 200,000 American Indians live in this area. NDSU is centrally located in this three-state region in Fargo, ND--sixty miles north of South Dakota and just across the Red River from Moorhead, Minnesota. The MPH Program located at NDSU has existing partnerships in various capacities with nearly all 23 tribes in the region as well as with key community-based organizations--Great Plains Tribal Chairmen's Health Board (GPTCHB) located in SD and the Tri-State Area Health Education Center based in MN which includes centers in all three states. In addition, the NDSU MPH Program works closely with both the ND and SD Departments of Health. Over the Initial three to five years of the Endowed Scholarship, outreach will take place with all tribes and Tribal Colleges in MT, WY, NE, and IA to further expand the impact of the scholarship. It is expected that within five to ten years, AIs from every region of the nation will apply for the endowed scholarship. In the long-term, the populations served will include AIs nationally.

Benefits to Population Served

Benefits can be considered for two stakeholder groups: Scholarship Recipients and Populations Served by public health professionals. Scholarship recipients will benefit directly by reducing the financial burden of pursuing graduate-level education and by expanding their career opportunities. This scholarship program will increase the numbers of qualified applicants to the MPH Program who might not have applied without financial assistance. In terms of populations served by public health services, the communities in which MPH graduates will work as public health professionals will benefit tremendously by having access to well-trained personnel who will design and implement public health programs to improve population health status. Over time, the cohort of NDSU MPH / Helmsley-funded scholars will have a tremendous impact on improving population health.

Implementation Strategies--Operational

The overall implementation strategy for the Endowed Scholarship includes: (1) tribal engagement; and (2) building upon existing relationships that the MPH Program and MPH Director have with tribes and tribal organizations.

Tribal engagement—each tribe is a sovereign entity with its own elected officials, health programs, educational systems, tribal colleges, etc. Dr. Warne will work with all four tribal nations in ND as well as the 23 tribes in the tri-state region of ND, SD, and MN in the first 3-5 years of the scholarship program to recruit potential students and to increase awareness. In the first 5-10 years of the scholarship, Dr. Warne and his staff will ensure that the National Indian Health Board and other national and regional AI health organizations are involved in recruiting potential students to apply for the Endowed Scholarship. In terms of appropriate methods to reach and engage members of the tribal populations, NDSU MPH Program leadership, including Dr. Warne and the AIPHRC staff, are the regional experts in tribal community engagement. In terms of cultural competence, Dr. Warne is an enrolled member of a SD tribe (Oglala Sioux Tribe), and he has spent his life and career immersed in tribal culture and health program development. In addition, all five Tribal Colleges in ND have been engaged regarding the need to expand public health education and to expand workforce development in tribal communities to more effectively address health issues in a sustainable manner.

Building upon existing relationships--Dr. Warne's past experiences in working with the regional tribal populations include serving as the former Executive Director of GPTCHB. In this capacity, Dr. Warne oversaw all Health Board activities, including regional public health programs, and he had a principal role in advocacy for the regional tribes. The Board of Directors of GPTCHB includes the highest elected officials (Chairmen) from the 18 tribal communities in the Great Plains Area of the IHS, and Dr. Warne maintains an excellent working relationship with all regional tribes.

Implementation Strategies--Financial / Sustainability

The proposed grant from the Trust to establish the Endowed Scholarship in American Indian Public Health is essential to recruit, retain, and graduate well-trained public health professionals who will work toward improving AI health status. Long-term, the Endowed Scholarship will operate on the interest generated by the endowment (\$750,000). These funds are eligible for state of ND matching funds of fifty cents per dollar (\$375,000). This will create an endowment of \$1.125M with interest generated at approximately \$40,000 per year for scholarship. This will create four \$10,000 scholarships annually, in perpetuity. An application for matching funds has been submitted, and notice of award should occur shortly following receipt of funding from the Trust.

Staffing

No new staff members will need to be hired for this project. Existing MPH and NDSU staff will coordinate the operational aspects of the Endowed Scholarship, including reviewing applications, scoring applicants and coordinating awards / tuition, etc.

Contribution to Overall Mission

Mission: The Mission of the MPH Program at NDSU is to promote health and welf-being in diverse

populations with an emphasis on American Indian and other underserved populations by providing educational, practical, and research opportunities for public health professionals.

The Mission of the Helmsley-funded AIPHRC is to address public health disparities through technical assistance, policy development, self-determination feasibility analyses, education, research, and programming in partnership with tribes primarily in the Northern Plains region and nationally. This is consistent with the Mission of NDSU to address the needs and aspirations of people in a changing world by building on our land-grant foundation, and it will bring this mission to the AI population in a direct, meaningful, and measurable manner.

The Endowed Scholarship will contribute directly to the Missions of the University, MPH Program, and the AIPHRC in terms of addressing the significant public health needs of the AI population through public heath education and workforce development.

Partners

The primary partners for the MPH Program include the ND and regional tribes. In addition, partnerships exist at the state and national levels.

Relationships to other institutions and agencies:

- National Indian Health Board--NIHB is composed of tribal leaders from every region in the nation, and their Board of Directors has officially endorsed the NDSU MPH Program and the American Indian Public Health track. This relationship will be vital to recruiting potential scholarship recipients nationally.
- The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust—The Trust seeks to improve rural healthcare. The Rural Healthcare Program serves the upper Midwest states of ND, SD, NE, MT, WY and western MN and IA. The Trust has been engaged for partnership and funding opportunities to develop and expand Center activities.
- North Dakota Tribal College Consortium--The Consortium has been engaged to Identify potential public health professions education and training opportunities.
- Great Plains Tribal Chairmen's Health Board--Dr. Warne serves as the Senior Policy Advisor to the GPTCHB, and this partnership will assist in identifying potential scholarship applicants as well as practicum project opportunities for students.

State Programs:

- North Dakota Department of Health--The NDSU MPH Program works with the Community Transformation Grant (CDC-funded) to provide AI health data coordination, community engagement, and health needs assessments.
- Statewide Vision and Strategy--The NDSU MPH Program Director is a member of the SVS. Its purpose is to identify and develop areas of public health coordination between the public and private sectors.

Federal Programs:

- Indian Health Service--The NDSU MPH Program Director works in close partnership with the IHS to identify areas of collaboration to improve public health services in American Indian communities. These relationships will assist the Scholarship Program in identifying potential applicants and public health workforce needs based on health data and stakeholder input.
- Health Services and Resources Administration—The NDSU MPH Program Director works in close partnership with Region VIII HRSA to conduct outreach and engagement with regional tribes to identify and pursue funding and programmatic opportunities. These relationships will assist the MPH Program in expanding the scope of public health activities and resources for potential student practicums and projects.
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention--NDSU MPH faculty work closely with several
 centers and operating units within CDC. These relationships will also assist in expanding the
 scope of MPH Programmatic activities and resources.
- Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services--NDSU MPH faculty work closely with several
 centers and operating units within CMS. These relationships will also assist in expanding the

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scope of MPH Program activities and resources and associated student opportunities.

We anticipate that we will award 2 scholarships per year to incoming, first-year MPH students in the American Indian Public Health track. The students may be AI, but this is not a requirement. At NDSU, we have AI students in other tracks in addition to the AI track, and we have non-Indians in the AI track. We encourage diversity in each track, and we encourage non-Indians who are interested in working with tribal populations to pursue the AI track as well.

In the first five years of the Endowed Scholarship Program, Effectiveness will be measured by:

- 1. At least 3 applicants for the scholarship per year
- 2. At least 2 applicants from the tri-state area of ND, SD, and MN
- 3. 100% graduation rate of scholarship recipients.

By year ten of the Endowed Scholarship Program, Effectiveness will be measured by:

- 1. Each scholarship recipient has worked with AI populations in public health for a minimum of two years.
- Each scholarship recipient will maintain connectivity to the MPH Program with career updates and by recruiting other potential students to apply for the scholarship.

3. Each scholarship recipient will be able to demonstrate how his/her public health service is making a positive impact on health status.
