Problems of political science as a discipline, political systems, political behavior.

POLS 115 American Government

Principles of American government, political behavior, institutions.

POLS 116 State & Local Government

Structures, politics and behavior in states and local governments.

POLS 120 Terrorism

Examination of problems of terrorism.

POLS 210 Current Politics

Study of current national and state political issues.

POLS 215 Problems & Policies in American Government

Study of the functioning of American government focusing on the policy process.

POLS 220 International Politics

Concepts, theories, and issues in international relations.

POLS 225 Comparative Politics I

Principles, behavior, and structure of foreign governments.

POLS 226 Comparative Politics II

Further study of principles, behavior, and structure of foreign governments.

POLS 227 US-Canada Politics

Study of Canadian governments, and their relationship with the United States.

POLS 230 Judicial Process

Role of lawyers, judges, and courts in the political system. Special emphasis on judicial decision making and the ideas behind law.

POLS 236 American Constitution-Civil Liberties

This course analyses U.S. Supreme Court decisions and interpretations which focus on civil liberties; equal protection, due process and First Amendment rights.

POLS 240 Political Ideologies

Study of ideas, belief systems, and basic principles of ideologies.

POLS 250 Politics of Public Administration

Introduction to Public Administration in the U.S., methods and concepts of Public Administration.
